## PRINCIPAL'S COLUMN

**OUR SCHOOL VALUES: Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Collaboration.**

**RETURN TO ONSITE LEARNING.** Well done to students and staff as we have made a smooth transition back to onsite learning. A Return to School Plan was distributed to parents/cares via Compass last Thursday, below is a quick summary of the main points.

- Parents/carers are to ensure their child/ren are at school no later than 8:50am. Once at school, the children are to walk through one of the gates by themselves as we need to limit parent/carer/visitor access. Please prepare your child/ren for this. Staff will be available to support students who may need it. Once inside the gate students are to come into school, put their bag away and play outside before the music plays and bell rings at 9:00am.
- Due to density limits (1 person per 4 square metres, which includes students and staff), parents/carers/visitors are not able to come into the school buildings. If you need to contact the school, please phone the office on 5263 1231. To contact a teacher, phone the school or send them an email.
- It is important at all times that parents/carers do not congregate in groups. Adults must follow the social distancing protocols of keeping at least 1.5m apart and wear a face mask outdoors when physical distancing is not possible.
- At the end of the school day (3:30pm), parents/carers of Junior (P-2) students can wait for their children outside the Café area. The Junior teachers will walk the children to this area so parents can collect them.
- To prevent traffic congestion at the Kiss N Drop area (car parks at the front of the school), parents are asked to safely and quickly move their vehicles in and out of this area both before and after school.
- If anyone (staff, parents/cares or students) is unwell and/or showing even the mildest of symptoms of COVID-19, please get tested and isolate until they get their results.

- If you are picking your child up from Out of School Hours Care, please park at the front and phone the school. A staff member will then send your child out to you.

**LOST PROPERTY.** We are checking this each day and returning clothing to children. A reminder to please check all clothing is clearly named.

**STUDENT REPORTS.** Staff have been busy collecting and analysing student data and work samples to complete the children's semester report which is due to be distributed to parents next week via Compass. Thanks to the staff for their work on this task and the time that goes into report writing.

**PARENT TEACHER CONVERSATIONS.** The Semester 1 Parent/Teacher conversations will be held on Wednesday 23rd June from 1:00-6:00pm. Parents are asked to book a 15 minute session to have a conversation with your child's teacher. For the Juniors, this is your child's English and Maths teacher and for the Seniors this is your child's Home Group teacher. When we can confirm how the conversations will be held (face-to-face or telephone call) due to COVID restrictions, we'll send out a notification via Compass.

**BOOKING YOUR PARENT/TEACHER CONVERSATION.** To book your session, you will need to log onto Compass using your individual username and password.

- Using a computer - Once you have logged into COMPASS, you will see an event titled "Parent Teacher Conversation Sem 1 2021". Click on that and follow the prompts to make your individual booking.
- Using a smart phone – Open up the COMPASS app and select "Conferences". Click on the "Parent Teacher Conversation Sem 1 2021" event and follow the prompts to make your individual booking.

If you experience any difficulties, please contact the school.

**SOFTFALL.** In the interests of student safety, this week we took delivery of another 10 metres of softfall to replenish the supply in the playground.

It was wonderful to share all the things in our life that we are grateful for and the students were very interested to learn that their rights are recognised.



Some of the Grade 3 and 4 students completed designing their STEM challenge to make something new that would be a useful tool in our school vegetable garden. The classroom was buzzing with creative chatter as students thought about the science, technology, engineering and maths they would need to know about in order to design their ideas. Here are some of the fabulous inventions they sketched up.



Nita designed a Sapling greenhouse that is attached to an App to help it work. Alex created a weed picker that can decipher the difference



between a weed and a plant! Isobel made a twofold tool that is a shovel at one end and a rake at the other and then also doubled her design by making a watering and seed can which drops seeds in from one side and waters them from another. Jerome impressed us all with his TabletGNV which is a tablet designed especially for our school garden, and when you press the item on the corresponding App, the item you require will 3D print before your eyes and be available to help your every gardening need from a 'seed shooter' to a 'chain

saw'!
