PRINCIPAL'S COLUMN

School Values: Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Collaboration.

BOOK WEEK DRESS UP DAY.

This will be held on Friday 25th August. All students, including our 2024 Preps, are encouraged to come to school dressed as a favourite book character. At the beginning of the day students will meet in their home groups before we hold our parade in the Stadium at 9:30am so we can see everyone's costumes. Following the Parade, the students will be placed into multi-aged groups to



read the Book Week books and complete activities related to them. The theme this year is 'Read, Grow Inspire'.

NAPLAN Results. A summary of this year's results is below. These results are one data set used to assess student achievement. We collect other data to judge individual student achievement.

- Reading above similar schools and network schools Gr 3 and 5.
- Writing above similar schools and network schools Gr 3 and 5.
- Spelling below similar schools and network schools Gr 3 and 5.
- Numeracy at or above similar schools and network schools Gr 3 and Gr 5.
- Grammar and Punctuation at or above similar schools and network schools Gr 3 and Gr 5.

LEARNING – STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Maths). Each week our Grade Prep-2 students participate in a STEM session, which we call Tinker Time. In these sessions the children may work in collaborative groups and use various materials, and their creativity, to build and make things. The Grade 3-6 students also do STEM, which we call Maker Space. In these sessions the children may be given the challenge of working in collaborative groups and use materials to build an object. The children are encouraged to have growth mindset and ask themselves "Why didn't that work?", "How can I fix that/try again?" to become successful. STEM activities are aligned to the Victorian Curriculum and success is determined by setting success criteria for each lesson.

WELLBEING. The school has a termly Wellbeing Plan to support mental health and wellbeing. It is developed by our Wellbeing Team, comprising staff and Grade 6 'values' leaders. Each week we teach the children how to show our Value of the Week using the strategy 'Tell, Show, Practice'. The Value of the Week is introduced during the preceding Assembly by the Grade 6 'values' leaders. Aspects of the School Wide Positive Behaviour Support initiative as well as the Rights, Resilience and Respectful Relationships initiative are used to support mental health and wellbeing.

VALUE OF THE WEEK. This week we are focusing on: Kindness – We are friendly and genuine. Next week we will focus on: Respect - We are inclusive of each-other.

BOOKS. Soon we will spend \$2,500 to replenish our home readers.

FUNDRAISER - JOLLY SOCKS FOR FATHER'S DAY. We are looking for volunteers to help with this fundraiser to purchase even more books for the students to read. If you can assist, please contact Twiggy (parent) or the office.

2023 PARENT / CAREGIVER / GUARDIAN OPINION SURVEY. All families were sent an invitation via Compass to participate in this survey, which is open from Monday 7 August to Friday 8 September. A notification was sent via Compass to all families with instructions to access the survey.

SCHOOL COUNCIL. We met this week and below is a summary:

- Curriculum Days. Each year schools receive four student-free days. Our remaining day is Tuesday 17 October. This will be a student-free day as staff will be attending Day 2 of Berry St professional learning.
- Professional Practice Days. The Victorian Government Schools Agreement 2022 provides teachers with two professional practice days in 2023. The Department of Education is recommending schools hold one professional practice day on the same day for all staff. This student-free day will be held on Monday 20th November with staff planning for 2024. The second day will not be a student-free day.
- An update was provided regarding the installation of our new inclusive playground.
- We discussed and approved two fundraisers: Jolly Socks for Father's Day, Christmas Raffle.
- The following polices were approved and will soon appear on our website: Inclusion and Diversity, Respect for School Staff, Statement of Values and School Philosophy
- We discussed the possibility of lunch orders being provided.
- We reviewed the dates for our Riverbank Markets, major fundraisers for the school. The dates are November 5, January 1 and January 13 and we will be asking parents/carers to assist. All Markets are from 9am-4pm.

For our Riverbank Markets, we need an electrician and gas plumber on site when stall holders are setting up (about 8:30am) to check electrical cords and gas connections. This is a paid position, so if you know someone who may be interested, please contact the school.

OPEN AFTERNOON. Assembly will not be held next week as we invite all parents/carers/special people into the school from 3-3:25pm next Friday to view some of the work the children have been completing at school.

They're Back

Dear Parents/Guardians/Carers,

It has come to my attention that some students in the school may have head lice and I seek your cooperation in checking your child's hair.

Head lice do not transmit infectious diseases – they are transmitted by having head to head contact with someone who has head lice. You may be reassured to know that head lice are commonly found in places other than at our school. Head lice are common in school-aged children and are the most adaptable of creatures. They have survived living solely on humans for 10,000 years!!!!

What can you do?

I seek your cooperation in checking your child's hair and in those instances where head lice or eggs are found, treating your child's hair. Please visit www.betterhealth.vic.gov.au and search for "head lice (nits)" for advice on finding, treating and preventing head lice.

If head lice or eggs are found on your child's hair you need to inform:

- *the school and advise when the treatment has started
- *parents or carers of your child's friends so they too have the opportunity to detect and treat their children if necessary.

When can my child return to school?

Health regulations requires that where a child has head lice, that child should not return to school until the day after appropriate treatment has started. Please note, this refers only to those children who have live head lice and does not refer to head lice eggs. More information about exclusion requirements can be found by searching for "school exclusion table" at www.health.vic.gov.au.

Anglesea Primary School is aware that head lice can be a sensitive issue and is committed to maintaining your confidentiality.

Assistance for families with uniform/shoe purchases:

Who is eligible?

State Schools' Relief provides support to any Victorian student attending a government school (primary, secondary or specialist), on the advice of the school. Schools are able to submit an application directly, via our online portal, whenever they believe there is a need to support a student whose family/carers are facing difficulty in providing the appropriate uniform, footwear or educational items for attending school.

- Situations include, but are not limited to:
- Unemployment
- Health issues/illness
- · Financial difficulties
- Independent living and/or homelessness
- · Natural disasters, house fires
- Bereavement
- Domestic violence

All applications are processed within 24 - 48 hours and you will receive confirmation of application/s by email. Orders will then be delivered within 4 working days.
