


OPEN AFTERNOON AND SEESAW

Like earlier this year, on Friday 28th October we will host an Open Afternoon to allow parents/carers to visit the school and see some of the work the children have been doing. A priority this year is to strengthen home-school communication, so we hope the Open Afternoon from 3-3:25pm will again provide an opportunity for this. Also, on this day we have scheduled for the teachers to share a task via Seesaw that the students have completed at school.

BERRY ST PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

This week Miss Fleur, Mrs Rankin, Mr Turner and Miss G attended the second (of four) professional learning sessions hosted by Berry Street. The Berry Street Education Model (BSEM) is a training course that enables educators to increase engagement with students who struggle in the classroom and successfully improve all students' self-regulation, growth and academic achievement. They provide strategies that enables teachers to increase engagement of students with complex, unmet learning needs and to successfully improve all students' self-



regulation, relationships, wellbeing, growth and academic achievement. Berry Street strategies incorporate trauma-informed teaching, positive education, and wellbeing practices across five domains (Body, Relationship, Engagement, Stamina and Character). These five domains correspond with child-development capacities that each student must build in order to be 'ready to learn'. When considering how to best meet the needs of students, teachers will focus on building students capacity to self-regulate, build and sustain relationships and then nurture willingness to engage in learning. When teachers create a proactive, pre-emptive, strengths-based classroom, students learn better. This year Miss Fleur, Mrs Rankin, Mr Turner and Miss G have completed the Body and Relationship domains and next year we will complete the remaining domains. The sessions are spread out over 12 months to allow teachers time to incorporate the new strategies gained from the professional learning, giving them the opportunity and time to create a culture of academic persistence.

DAX Art Program

Wellbeing Art Program with the King Parrots and the Puppies began today! The DAX program (also known as the ELVA program) is a specialised Wellbeing program that focuses on teaching students how to become emotionally literate and resilient through the exploration and creation of art. By building resilience through art students strengthen their social and emotional learning and demonstrate positive outcomes for engagement, achievement, resilience and mental health. This year the whole school have been learning about Toas. Toas are small wooden and gypsum markers that appear to be unique to the Killapaninna Mission of South Australia. These sculptures/markers are placed in the ground as a type of signpost. In this unit students have been creating a "toa" (fence paling) about themselves, in particular, memories or experiences that give them a feeling of happiness or contentment. A symbol that tells others about themselves. When they are completed that the palings will be added to the fence at the front of the school building.







Junior News


It's been another busy week of learning in the JLC. Here is a snapshot of our week.


Senior Community News

Bluearth
