PRINCIPAL'S COLUMN

School Values: Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Collaboration.

Child Safe Anglesea Primary School is a child safe organisation which welcomes all children, young people and their families. We are committed to providing environments where our students are safe and feel safe, where their participation is valued, their views respected, and their voices are heard about decisions that affect their lives. Our child safe policies, strategies and practices are inclusive of the needs of all children and students. We have no tolerance for child abuse and take proactive steps to identify and manage any risks of harm to students in our school environments. Particular attention is given to the child safety needs of Aboriginal students, those from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, international students, students with disabilities, those unable to live at home, children and young people who identify as LGBTIQ+ and other students experiencing risk or vulnerability. Child safety is a shared responsibility.

STUDENTS REPORTS AND PARENT/CARER/TEACHER CONVERSATIONS. Thanks to our teachers for putting in extra time to write the students reports, to be sent to parents/carers on Thursday 20th June via Compass. Next week parents/carers will receive a Compass notification saying that bookings are open to discuss their child's report with their teacher. These will be held on Tuesday 25th June between 1:00 and 6:00pm and the conversations are for 10 minutes.

TEDDY BEARS PICNIC. On Friday 21st June from 11:30am to 1:30pm the Preps and their Grade 6 buddies will hold a Teddy Bears Picnic together. These children are invited to bring their teddies to school on this day.

SOUNDWRITE (SYNTHETIC PHONICS). This week the government announced an updated Teaching and Learning Model for all state schools, to be implemented from next year, which focuses on what's known as 'explicit teaching', with students from Prep to Gr 2 to be taught using phonics. Anglesea PS has been teaching phonics (Soundwrite) for a number of years.

STAFF CAR PARK. We've put some signs on the staff car park gate saying it isn't available for community use (eg. basketball) until 5pm. This is due to some of the staff cars receiving knocks from basketballs plus we've had some near misses with children running behind cars that are reversing.

2025 FOUNDATION (PREP) ENROLMENTS.

The Department of Education has released a new statewide Foundation (Prep) enrolment timeline. The timeline advises families when and how to enrol their child into Foundation (Prep) at a Victorian government primary school, including Anglesea Primary School.

The new timeline will apply for children starting Foundation (Prep) in 2025. All government primary schools will follow the new timeline in 2024 to support Foundation (Prep) enrolments for the 2025 school year.

Your child will start Foundation (Prep) from **29 January 2025**.

Maths -Sustainable House & Explanation

In Maths this week the students have been creating their own sustainable houses using 3D shapes. The students were required to identify the appropriate 2D nets to build their 3D shapes. Students were also required to identify and research sustainable fibres and infrastructure (Solar panels, wind turbines, water tanks) that they would utilise to help build their model. The students created an explanation piece that justified their reasoning for using their chosen sustainable fibres and why they implemented particular infrastructure to create their sustainable house.



Grades Five & Six Excursion



Thursday June 20th

Students in Senior A and Senior S will travel by bus to participate in two free sessions at Belmont High School. The bus will leave at 9am and return to school before 3:30. Students will need to bring recess, lunch and a refillable drink bottle.

Session 1. Beat that

Beat That will take students on a wonderful journey through the fascinating world of the human cardiovascular system, focusing on the heart and circulatory system. Beat That introduces applications of medical technologies and exercise science equipment. Students will learn about the cardiovascular system, collect and analyse their own heart rate data using graphs, and mathematical analysis techniques. Through the use of data logging technology, students will participate in an experimental investigation which will allow them to analyse and interpret primary data.

Session 2. What makes me tick

What Makes Me Tick will take students on an adventure into the human body looking at several important components such as cells, DNA, the skeletal, muscular and nervous systems.

Students work in small groups with mentors to perform chemistry experiments, problem solve and utilise scientific technology such as microscopes, micropipettes and 3D models.
