I hope everyone has had a restful long weekend. We are nearing the end of Term 2. Students and teachers have been very busy working towards achieving learning goals.

GMHBA HEALTHY HEROES. On Friday, our Grade 3 and 4 students had a visit from some players from the Geelong Football Club as part of their Healthy Heroes schools outreach program. We had some very excited students who were very happy to meet premiership players Rhys Stanley and Sam De Koning.

BIOCATS EXCURSION. Next Monday, our Grade 5 and 6 students will be heading to GMHBA Stadium in Geelong to participate in the BioCats session. BioCats is a program that is run by BioLab, which is a State Government funded Biological and Sport Sciences based Science centre. Students will participate in a series of fitness and skill test which they will collect data from and compare to the standards of professional athletes. A note was sent home via Compass yesterday, parents/carers will need to opt into this activity. There is no cost to families for this excursion.

ANGLESEA ART SHOW. Over the long weekend the annual Anglesea Art Show was held at the hall. Reading




Maths
