PRINCIPAL'S COLUMN

Our child safe policies, strategies and practices are inclusive of the needs of all children and students. We have no tolerance for child abuse and take proactive steps to identify and manage any risks of harm to students in our school environments. Particular attention is given to the child safety needs of Aboriginal students, those from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, international students, students with disabilities, those unable to live at home, children and young people who identify as LGBTIQ+ and other students experiencing risk or vulnerability. Child safety is a shared responsibility.

Our Vision Anglesea Primary School is a creative and fun learning environment, that is accepting of all and promotes the following values: Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Collaboration. Students will strive for personal best, becoming independent and resilient learners who make a positive contribution to the community and environment.

VILLAGE FAIR – NEW DATE IS SATURDAY APRIL 13. Information was distributed to all families via Compass on Monday 12th March – see a copy below.

NEW AND INCLUSIVE PLAYGROUND. On Tuesday contractors commenced installation of the playground, to the south of the main building. The completion date is mid-April and the soil that has been removed has been stored for our front garden project.

FRONT GARDEN PROJECT. ANGAIR will visit the school on March 26 to remove some plants from our front garden with the children for replanting in May. In the Easter holidays, Ocean Road Landscaping will reconfigure the space and bring in topsoil. In May, we will replant the old plants and install new ones. This project will improve the appearance of the school, and our new garden will allow the children to learn about and care for native plants.

NEW STAFF MEMBER. We welcome Cathy to our staff as a teacher aide. She will work all day on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday to provide additional support to the children.

NAPLAN. Grade 3 and 5 students sat the Writing Test on Wednesday, the Conventions of Language Test on Thursday and the Reading Test today. On Monday they will do the Numeracy Test. For students absent on a Test day, catch-up Tests can be held up to and including Friday 21st March.

PARENT/CARER INFORMATION SESSION. QHub will provide a Parent/Carer information session at school on Tuesday 26th March from 3:45-4:45pm, with the focus being on supporting LGBTIQ+ young people. To learn more information about this, or if you have any questions, please feel welcome to attend. More information is below.

FEES. Information was distributed to parents/carers via Compass on Wednesday. Thanks to those families who have already paid the school fees and made Buildings and Grounds Improvements donations. This allows us to provide our programs and help purchase the resources we need to support student learning and wellbeing.

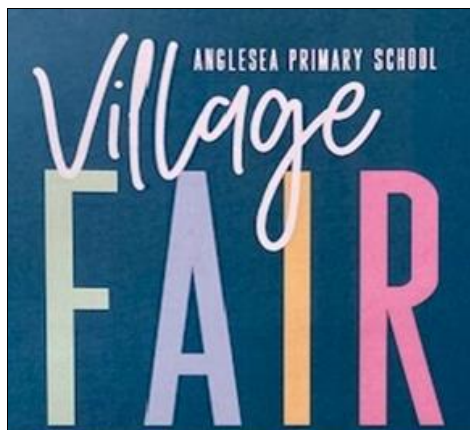


Currently at Stage 2 of our planning process, we're inviting community and key stakeholders to share their knowledge, interests, values, and concerns with us.

This week our Years 3 and 5 students began NAPLAN testing. So far the students have completed the Writing, Reading and Conventions of Language tests.

Testing concludes on Monday with the Numeracy test. For any Year 3 or 5 students who have been absent for any of the tests, 'catch-up' sessions have been timetabled for next week once they are back at school.

Please make sure that any participating children are at school on time on these days as late arrival will affect the entire cohort.

We must commend all participating students for their fantastic attitudes towards completing these tests. All students have been trying their best.

SSA Cross-Country

On Monday 25th March, all Years 3-6 students will be participating in the SSA (inter-school) Cross-Country. Students will depart Anglesea Primary School by bus at 9am sharp and return to school around 1pm. It is important that all students are at school on time as to not delay the departure. As it is an outdoor event, it is important for students to bring clothing that is appropriate to wear for completing in this event as well as clothing for when not competing. Students will also need their snack and lunch and a refillable drink bottle. Some students may even require extra food due to energy expenditure.

Specialists

On Mondays, students are participating in Bluearth. Bluearth is a program that focuses on self-regulation through movement and is part of our wellbeing program. Students work on precise gross motor skills and movements while developing their resilience and corporation through being 'your own umpire'.

As these sessions involve a lot of movement, students will need to wear appropriate footwear.

Outdoor Adventure Program

Today, students from the SLC continued their Outdoor Adventure Programs.

Year 3s had another session with Great Ocean Road Coastal Committee learning about our local environment.

Year 4s continued Bike Ed at school where students learned about how we ride on the road in pairs and how we ride through intersections. We ask that students continue to practise their scooting, signalling and head check skills at home as part of their bike riding skills development.

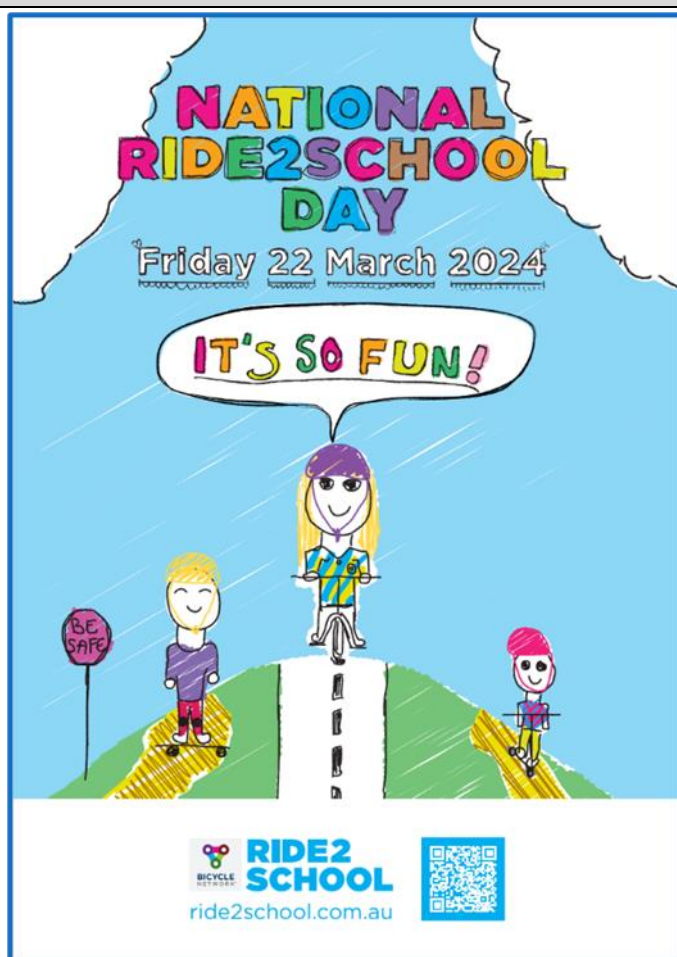
Senior Class in the Spotlight

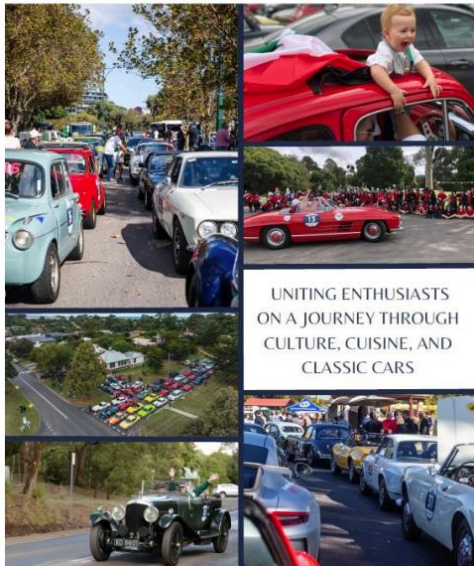
