PRINCIPAL'S COLUMN

School Values: Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Collaboration.

Child Safe Anglesea Primary School is a child safe organisation which welcomes all children, young people and their families. We are committed to providing environments where our students are safe and feel safe, where their participation is valued, their views respected, and their voices are heard about decisions that affect their lives. Our child safe policies, strategies and practices are inclusive of the needs of all children and students. We have no tolerance for child abuse and take proactive steps to identify and manage any risks of harm to students in our school environments. Particular attention is given to the child safety needs of Aboriginal students, those from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, international students, students with disabilities, those unable to live at home, children and young people who identify as LGBTIQ+ and other students experiencing risk or vulnerability. Child safety is a shared responsibility.

Our Vision Anglesea Primary School is a creative and fun learning environment, that is accepting of all and promotes the following values: Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Collaboration. Students will strive for personal best, becoming independent and resilient learners who make a positive contribution to the community and environment.

PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE DAY / 2024 PLANNING. Monday 20th November is a pupil free day and staff will be at school drafting 2024 classes. To do this, we need to know the students we will have. If you know of someone who hasn't enrolled their child/ren for next year, please ask them to contact the school ASAP. If you have changing circumstances in 2024 and this will be reflected in your child's enrolment, please contact the office ASAP.

BEACH SAFETY AND AWARENESS. This annual program commences on Monday 27th November and concludes on Friday 8th December. Over the course of the program, students will learn and practise water safety skills in the local aquatic environment (Pt Roadknight beach) to become aware of beach and water conditions and safety considerations when at the beach. Students will learn about where and when it is safe to enter the water, how to signal for help, simulate rescue techniques and participate in various beach water activities to become more comfortable with the beach environment. Thanks to the Swimming in School Program (funded by DET) we can deliver this program at a cost of \$52 per student. Payment is to be received by Thursday 24th November via Cash or BPAY to secure your child's attendance at this activity. For a confidential discussion about financial support options, or if you would like to discuss alternative payment arrangements, please contact the school. And we ask that all three forms are completed in hard copy and returned to the office by Wednesday 22nd November.

Who is eligible?

Schools are able to submit an application directly, via our online portal, whenever they believe there is a need to support a student whose family/carers are facing difficulty in providing the appropriate uniform, footwear or educational items for attending school.

- Situations include, but are not limited to:
- Unemployment
- Health issues/illness
- Financial difficulties
- Independent living and/or homelessness
- Natural disasters, house fires
- Bereavement
- Domestic violence

All applications are processed within 24 - 48 hours and you will receive confirmation of application/s by email. Orders will then be delivered within 4 working days.
