PRINCIPAL'S COLUMN

School Values: Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Collaboration.

Child Safe Anglesea Primary School is a child safe organisation which welcomes all children, young people and their families. We are committed to providing environments where our students are safe and feel safe, where their participation is valued, their views respected, and their voices are heard about decisions that affect their lives. Our child safe policies, strategies and practices are inclusive of the needs of all children and students. We have no tolerance for child abuse and take proactive steps to identify and manage any risks of harm to students in our school environments. Particular attention is given to the child safety needs of Aboriginal students, those from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, international students, students with disabilities, those unable to live at home, children and young people who identify as LGBTIQ+ and other students experiencing risk or vulnerability. Child safety is a shared responsibility.

Our Vision Anglesea Primary School is a creative and fun learning environment, that is accepting of all and promotes the following values: Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Collaboration. Students will strive for personal best, becoming independent and resilient learners who make a positive contribution to the community and environment.

BEACH SAFETY AND AWARENESS The program commenced on Monday and got off to a smooth start until some inclement weather. Thursday's program was cancelled, but will be moved to Wednesday next week so the children will have a full week at the beach.

2024 CLASSES AND TEACHERS. Last Monday we drafted next year's classes. These will be finalised before Friday 15th December when students and teachers will spend time in their 2024 classes. Parents/carers will be notified of 2024 classes before this day.

END OF YEAR REPORTS AND TEACHER/PARENT/CARER CONVERSATIONS. Thanks to our teachers for putting in extra time to write the students reports, to be sent to parents/carers on Friday 8th December via Compass. Today parents/carers will receive a Compass notification saying that bookings are open to discuss their child's report with the teacher. These will be held on Wednesday 13th December between 1:00 and 6:00pm.

END OF YEAR CELEBRATION. At the end of each year, some events/excursions/incursions are held to allow the children to celebrate the year's achievements. To reduce costs for families, this year we are doing something different. 'Duncan's Christmas Disco!' (thanks Mr Lester for organising and providing equipment) will be held in the Stadium on Wednesday 20th December. The Junior disco is from 9:30-10:30am, the Senior disco 11:10am-12pm and a whole-school disco 12-12:30pm. Students are welcome to come dressed in Christmas attire. Lunch is 12:30-12:45, lunch play 12:45-1:30, the end of year Assembly 1:45-2:15, 'The Arch' to farewell students 2:15-2:30 with dismissal at 2:30pm.

PREP TRANSITION. Our future preps will visit us for their last transition session on Friday 15th December from 10am-12:30pm. A Prep parent/carer information will be held in the Stadium from 11:30am-12pm to be followed by a light lunch until 12:30pm.

Who is eligible?

State Schools' Relief provides support to any Victorian student attending a government school (primary, secondary or specialist), on the advice of the school. Schools are able to submit an application directly, via our online portal, whenever they believe there is a need to support a student whose family/carers are facing difficulty in providing the appropriate uniform, footwear or educational items for attending school.

- Situations include, but are not limited to:
- Unemployment
- · Health issues/illness
- · Financial difficulties
- Independent living and/or homelessness
- · Natural disasters, house fires
- Bereavement
- Domestic violence

All applications are processed within 24 - 48 hours and you will receive confirmation of application/s by email. Orders will then be delivered within 4 working days
