Congratulations to some students who have achieved their '100 nights of reading' certificate and sticker. Your persistence is amazing and we love hearing your reading progress!

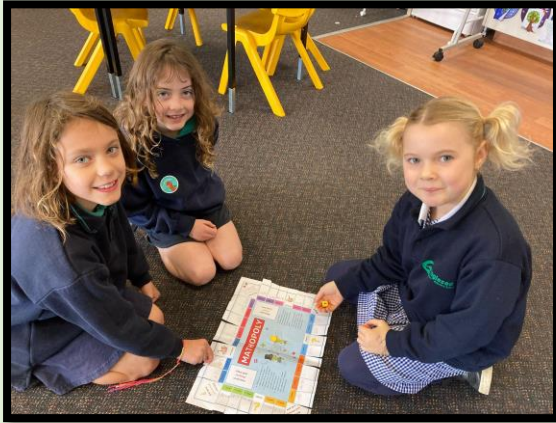


Lost property/Missing items

Writing:

This week the Grade 5/6 students continued their biography writing journey. The students were blown away by the achievements of the famous Indigenous people that they researched. This has allowed the students to create some really engaging biography pieces that have been shared with their peers to further educate them on many of the amazing things that were done by these famous Indigenous people.

Maths:

This week in Maths, the Grade 5/6 students have delved deeper into their time unit. The students have been building upon their 'Time' skills to carefully construct their perfect day at Melbourne Camp. The students have also been working on a project that looks at the time it took each student from Senior A and Senior L to run a lap of the oval, from this data the students have been required to find the range and average times of each class and then the whole cohort. This data will be used further next week to determine the median and how we can use different types of graphs to create a visual representation of this data.

SEX, CONSENT AND STAYING SAFE
