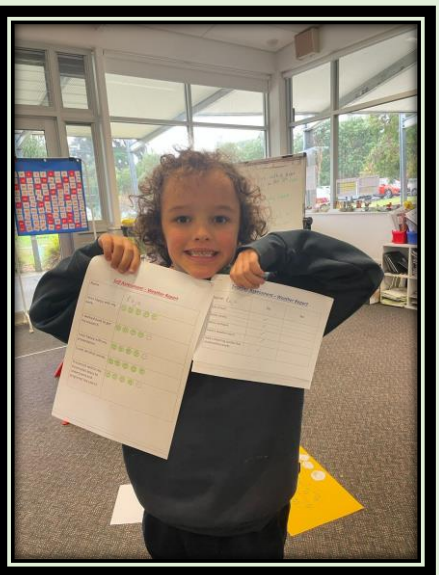
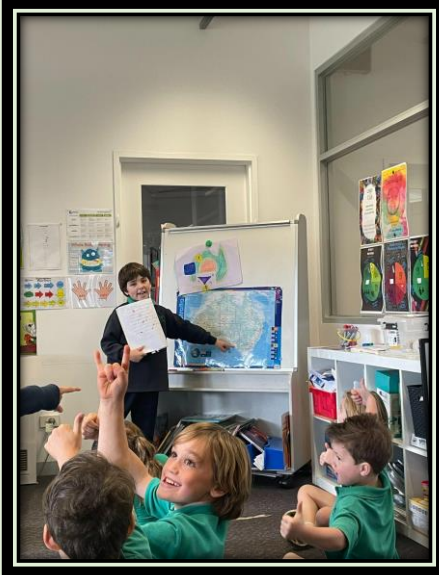

All applications are processed within 24 - 48 hours and you will receive confirmation of application/s by email. Orders will then be delivered within 4 working days.

BioCats

This week the Grade 5/6 students participated in a BioCats session at the GMHBA stadium. The session was run in alignment with the Geelong Football Club. The purpose of the program was to teach the students about STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) Education and how it is integrated into an AFL football club. The students participated in a number of testings such as a grip test, vertical leap, 20m sprint, and a reflex test; as well students also recorded their heights and wingspans. The students were required to record and graph their results.

The second half of the session saw the students put into groups to work through six different stations to solve mathematical equations that were relatable to the Geelong Football club. The members of the group who got the most answers correct were rewarded with a Geelong Cats diary.

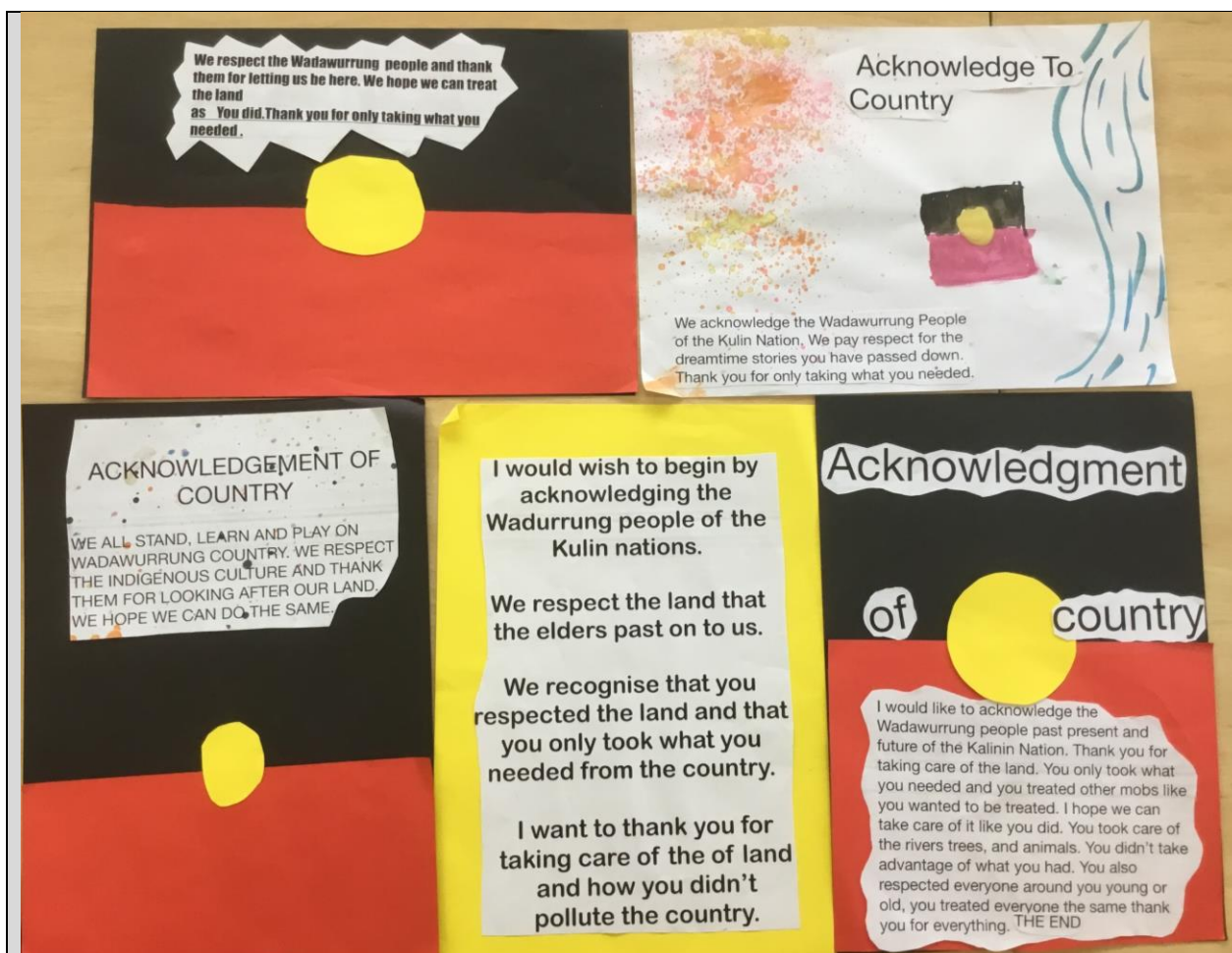
It was great to see the students so engaged throughout the excursion!
