PRINCIPAL'S COLUMN

School Values: Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Collaboration.

NAPLAN. Well done to our Grade 3 and 5 students who have sat the Writing, Reading Conventions of Language and Numeracy Tests. We are currently completing catch-up tests for students who were absent for the tests. Thanks again to our staff for being flexible to support the students complete the tests.

WRITERS WORKSHOP MODEL. This model details what our writing less. As a goal this year is to consistently implement the model, teachers reviewed the model and observed each-other teach to the model. They then gave and received feedback to each-other. Thanks to our teachers for working collaboratively to achieve this goal.

OPEN AFTERNOON. Thanks to the many parents/carers for attending this session on Friday. We hope this gives you a better understanding of how the school operates. It was great to see the children enjoying sharing their work.

SEESAW. Thanks to our teachers for sharing some of the work students have been completing at school via the Seesaw app. This takes time to organise and I thank them for doing this, so parents/carers have a greater understanding of the tasks students are completing at school. Please feel welcome to have a conversation at home with your child about what they are doing at school.

STUDENT SUPPORT GROUP (SSG) MEETINGS. Our teachers plan for and host SSG meetings with parents/carers of students with additional needs. In these meetings parents/carers and teachers work together to create goals, as well as update and monitor the adjustments and modifications that the student requires to be successful on their Individualised Learning Plan (IEP). These meetings are held when stated by the home group teacher and will be no

longer than 30 minutes in duration as I need to ensure teachers work no more than the 38 hours per week. As we need to schedule meetings for over 30 students per term, there is very limited opportunity to change meeting times.

MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLBEING. Miss Fleur attended another training session on Tuesday as part of her role as Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader to help us to support student mental health and wellbeing. During the session, Fleur shared the Tiered level of supports we use with our students for Emotional Regulation to a small group of teachers from other schools. She was then asked to share the strategies to everyone attending the WebEx videoconference. The strategies are:

- At tier 1; Promotion and Prevention at the whole school level All staff and students create personal Ready to Learn plans to communicate how they are feeling throughout the day. All teachers explicitly teach and use the emotional thermometer to support students in developing their emotional literacy.
- At tier 2; Early Intervention for individual students homegroup teachers and Miss Fleur collaborate with students over a period of time (about two weeks) to create a Personalised Regulation Plan. This plan explicitly details what strategies the student can use and where, when they are feeling a particular colour on the emotional thermometer. Miss Fleur and the student then create a poster detailing the plan for teachers and parents/carers.
- At tier 3; Intensive Individualised Support is provided to individual students these students already have a Ready to Learn plan and an Emotional Regulation Plan. Next, Miss Fleur conferences with the individual and their homegroup teacher to create a Break schedule. This is closely monitored each day, and we track what the children are feeling and what strategy they use to get back down to the blue or green on the emotional thermometer.

RIDE TO SCHOOL DAY – TOMORROW. All students are encouraged to ride/walk/scoot to school tomorrow.

SCHOOL ASSEMBLY. Assembly will be held on Friday at 3:10pm in the Stadium. All welcome.




Every child who actively travels to school will receive a sticker and a raffle ticket which gives them the opportunity to win a prize.
