SHADE GRANT - SUCCESSFUL. Our grant application to the School Shade Program provided by the Cancer Council / Department of Health to erect a timber gazebo over the outdoor seating in the garden was successful. This means we currently have three upcoming projects:

- Erecting a shade structure next to the Grade 5 and 6 classrooms using \$25,000 of School Shade Sail grant funding. Parents Club fundraising and school-based funds will provide a timber deck under the structure. We are hoping this is completed during the summer holiday break.
- Installing a new playground during 2023 using \$200,000 of Inclusive Schools Playground Grant funding.
- Installing a gazebo in the garden using \$19,500 of School Shade Program Grant funding.

OPEN AFTERNOON AND SEESAW. Tomorrow we will host an Open Afternoon to allow parents/carers to visit the school and see some of the work the children have been doing from 3-3:25pm. Also, on this day we have scheduled for the teachers to share a task via Seesaw that the students have completed at school.




Junior News

Request. The **Wallabies** will be commencing a unit of work around **units of measurement.** We would really appreciate it if you could send in empty bottles, milk cartons, cereal boxes etc. Students will be using these to explore and help them understand litres, millilitres, grams and kilograms.

It's been another busy week of learning in the JLC. Here is a snapshot!

Wallabies- Bounding into Learning

This week in Mathematics the Wallabies put their skills of multiplication, division, measurement, money and fractions into action, by completing an authentic learning experience. Students organised a 'Birthday Party' with pizzas, soft drinks, lolly bags and of course a birthday cake. First, each student decided on how many would be at his/her party, including themselves. Next, they worked out the fraction of pizza each person would get, and how many pizzas they would require to achieve this quantity. The Wallabies then decided how much each pizza would cost and calculated the total cost using multiplication. Students then decided they would buy 2 litre bottles of soft drink and how many cups each person would get. Students worked out that they would get 8 cups from each bottle, which helped them with how many bottles they would have to buy. Next, students partitioned their birthday cake into equal pieces to work out the fraction each person would get. Students with a larger number of guests decided on having more than one cake. Finally, students made a lolly bag and calculated the fraction of items. Then, they multiplied the bag by the number of guests to work out how much of each lolly they would need. We were impressed with how students could transfer their knowledge, strategies and skills learnt to complete this task with success. Well done, Wallabies!



Piranhas- Snapping up Success

Over the last 2 weeks the Piranhas have been designing a maths board game using the different skills they have learnt this year. To be successful students had to think of how they would engage their audience, the maths they would include, what materials they would need and how to modify their game until it worked.



To bring awareness to ADHD month students watched some videos and listened to stories that focused on diversity and what makes each one of us special due to the strengths we have. Students then created a puzzle piece drawing of themselves. We brainstormed a variety of their strengths. We then discussed our own strengths and what makes us special. We wrote our strengths onto each puzzle piece to represent our beautifully diverse class.




King Parrots & Persistent Puppies
