PARENT INFORMATION SESSION. Please find attached to this newsletter information which may be useful for parents and caregivers for supporting students with neurodiverse needs.

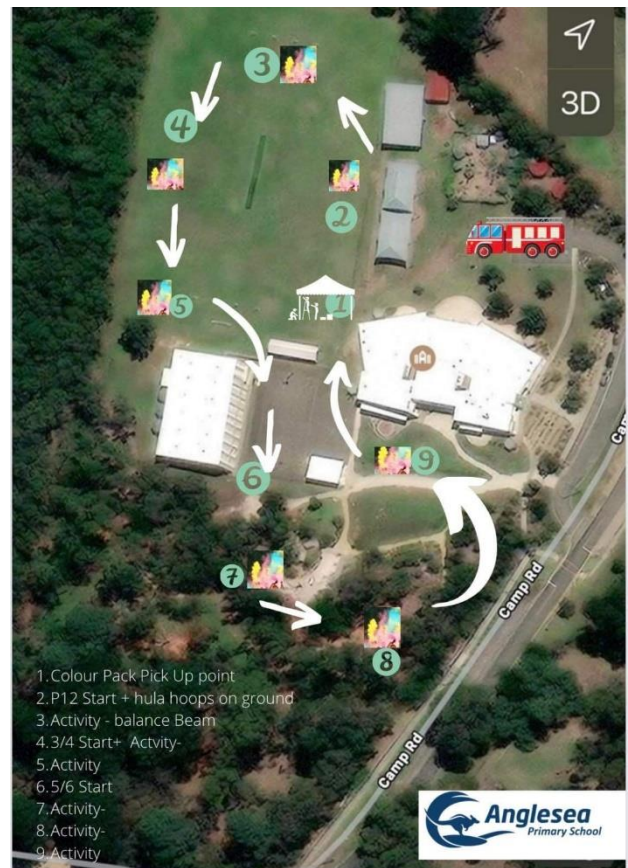

Welcome back to all of our school community. It is so wonderful to see everyone's happy and smiling faces again.

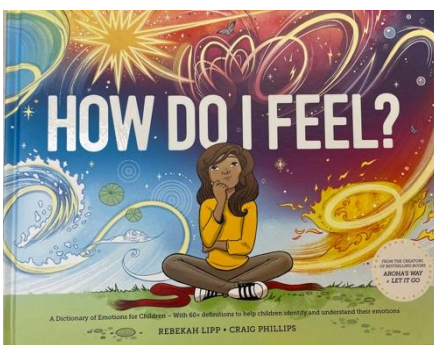
New Junior Lego Tables for Inclusive play

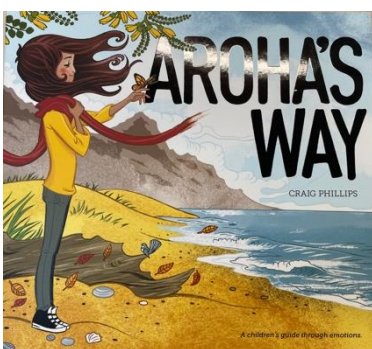


New Wellbeing Mentor Texts

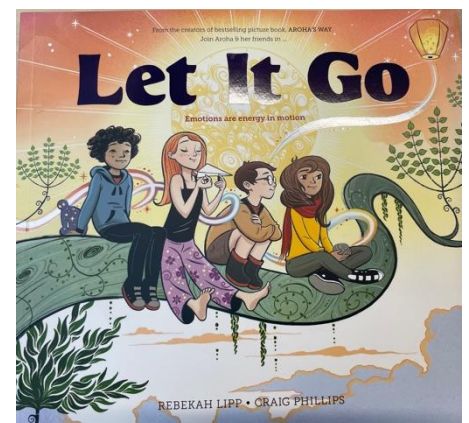

Junior News

Starting Right -Kindness/Collaboration

This week we had a focus on our school values of kindness and collaboration. Students worked on a number of tasks enabling them to practise teamwork and being a good friend.

Message in a Sock by Kaye Baillie and Narelda Joy

To commemorate ANZAC Day we read the story *Message in a Sock*. The story was about a mother who knitted socks for the soldiers during World War 1 and how her daughter put a special message into every sock, hoping one message would reach her father and bring him home safely. Next, students made a sock for a friend and wrote a kind message to them.



Friendship Soup

In Maths and Writing students watched a video about making **Friendship Soup**. After deciding what ingredients they wanted in their soup students used materials found in the classroom for the ingredients and measured each ingredient using metric units.



Students then wrote an instructional text to explain how to make the soup using verbs such as pour, drizzle, sprinkle and grate.

Junior R – Friendship Soup.

- Get a large soup pot.
- Add 2 cups of kindness.
- Mix in $\frac{1}{2}$ a cup of goofiness.
- Grate in $\frac{1}{2}$ a cup of fun.
- Preheat $\frac{1}{2}$ a cup of honesty and add.
- Drop in a mini origami balloon of arguments.
- Pour in a cup of respect.
- Fold in 2 cups of negotiation.
- Mix in $\frac{3}{4}$ cup of safety.
- Add in 1 cup of trust.
- Melt in $\frac{1}{2}$ a cup of collaboration.
- Mix in 1 cup of responsibility.
- Process a litre of patience and add.
- Combine a medium mini origami balloon of stress.
- Garnish with 2 cups of calm, 1 cup of laughter, $\frac{1}{2}$ a cup of love and a $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of excitement.
- Boil for $\frac{1}{2}$ an hour and cool slightly before eating with a side serve of garlic bread!!

iPads

As we start the term off, it would be wonderful if all students who have their own iPads (Grades 4-6) could bring them to school every day and have them fully charged. Although we aim to only use iPads, when necessary, throughout the day, it makes learning tasks difficult for students when it comes to a task that requires them to use their iPads and they are not here at school or do not have any charge. This is particularly important for Year 5 students who will be completing all their NAPLAN tests online using their iPads in week 3 of this term.

If you wish to have a conversation with a teacher, please email them to make an appointment. Teachers have scheduled commitments on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday after school. We ask that parents/carers do not approach teachers for a quick chat before school as teachers are preparing to teach.

Know Your Name Exhibition

Our Senior students have been invited to attend the 'Know Our Names Exhibition' happening in Anglesea next Monday 2nd May. Students will walk to and from school to visit the new Memorial Wall in Anglesea as well as the exhibition. There will be a military historian, who is also a storyteller providing a guided tour of the exhibition for our school students. Thank you to Ms Karren for organising this educational opportunity for our students.

Outdoor Adventure Program - Grade 3 and Grade 4

Grade 3s - The Grade 3 students' additional session for their Outdoor Adventure program "Explore and Discover Anglesea" has been rescheduled for **this Friday 29th April from 11:30am until 1:50pm**. This will involve the students travelling to and from Pt Roadknight beach to participate in 'Beach' activities. Transport to and from Pt Roadknight has been arranged by hiring the Anglesea Community Bus, to be driven by Lachlan Turner, at no cost to parents/carers. When students return to school, they will eat their lunch. For students who have ordered a sausage sizzle provided by our Parents Club, this will also be provided when they return to school.

Grade 4s - The 'Tour De Anglesea', which is our celebration of the Grade 4's completing the Bike Ed program, was postponed at the end of last term. The ride has been rescheduled for **this Friday 29th April from 11:30am until approx. 1:30pm**. Miss Fleur will follow the group in a support car while Mrs Virgona will join the students, along with a couple of staff from Camp Wilkin, riding the course. The route (to be finalised on the day dependent on the conditions due to preceding day's weather) is a mixture of quieter sealed and gravel roads linked up with Coogoorah Park trails, fire access trails and single tracks which will consolidate the skills students have learnt during the Bike Ed program. When students return to school, they will eat their lunch. For students who have ordered a sausage sizzle provided by our Parents Club, this will also be provided when they return to school.

Healthy Eats Brain Break

Breaks are an essential part of learning and students benefit from short breaks throughout the day. In addition to regular movement breaks, students in Grade 3/4 also have daily 'Healthy Eats Brain Breaks'. Brain Food Breaks are a set time in the classroom routine where students are offered vegetables or fruit and encouraged to drink water. Students who are not hungry and are hydrated perform better in the classroom, are less disruptive and have higher levels of engagement and concentration. Incorporating a healthy snack break into our daily brain breaks is a great way to reset students' focus as well as increase their fruit and veg intake.

What can students bring for Brain Break?

Quick, easy foods for Brain Food Breaks (no messy foods) including;

- All fresh fruit such as bananas, apples, berries, or watermelon. These can be whole or chopped up.
- All fresh vegetables such as carrots, celery, and cherry tomatoes.
- Dried fruit in small amounts (due to its concentrated sugar that can increase tooth decay).
- Water.

What types of snacks are not suitable for Brain Break?

- Other drinks – fruit and vegetable juices, cordial, mineral water, carbonated water
- Fruit products (eg fruit leather, fruit roll ups, fruit bars)
- Fruit canned in syrup or jelly
- Fruit Jams or jellies
- Pies, cakes, chips, vegetable pastries, cakes, quiches, breads, any processed/ packaged snacks

What do we ask parents/carers to do for Brain Food Breaks?

- Provide an extra vegetable or piece of fruit that is clean and easy to eat in class.
- Provide a small clear plastic refillable water bottle.

***It is important to note that Brain Food Breaks do not replace the food eaten at recess or lunch. This healthy snack is in addition to the foods already packed.*

Senior Specialists are on Wednesdays. Students will rotate through PE, Art, Music/Creative Arts and Indonesian. Can you please ensure that your child/ren wear appropriate footwear on this day to ensure that they are able to run and move comfortably and safely when doing PE.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN will be held between May 10th and May 20th. If you have any questions about NAPLAN, please feel free to contact Murray (Principal), Lachlan or Duncan (NAPLAN Co-ordinators) and we will do our best to assist you. The public demonstration site has detailed information about NAPLAN and examples of what the students will come across when they sit the test. This will be used by the teachers at school closer to NAPLAN to help the students become familiar with the system. 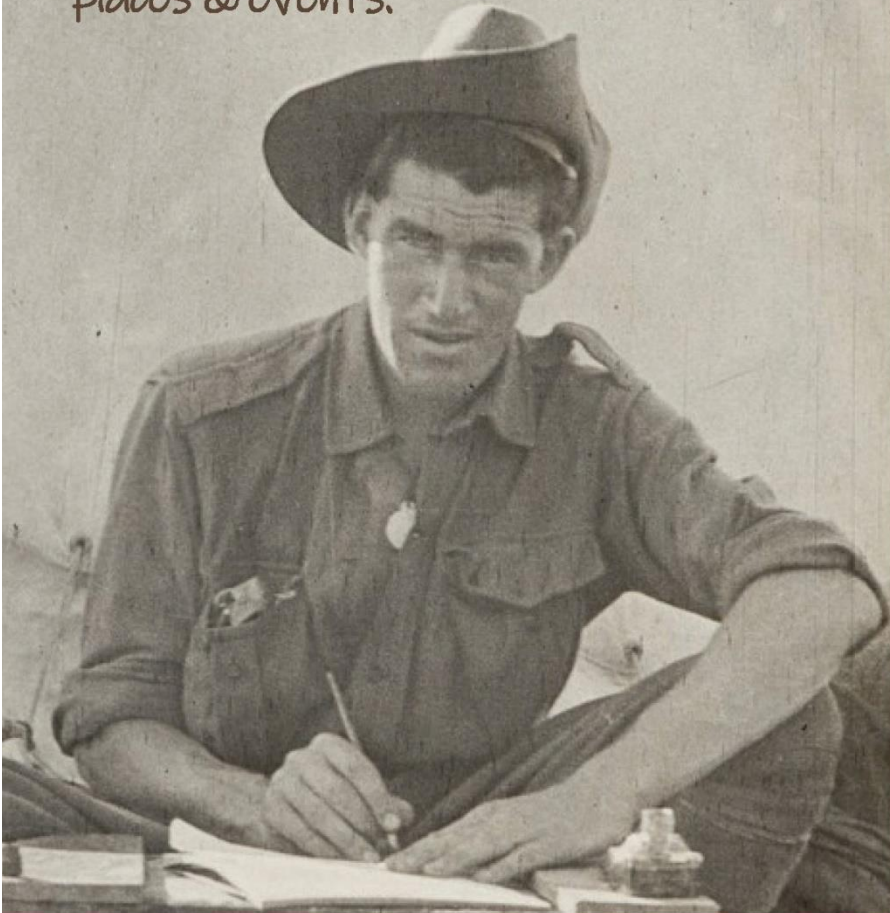
