# PRINCIPAL'S COLUMN

**School Values:** Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Collaboration.

There was a really positive atmosphere around the school on Tuesday morning as we welcomed back students and parents/carers to school. Thanks to our school community (students, staff and parents/carers) for helping us to have a successful start to 2023. Please remember to read the Newsletter each week to keep yourself informed.

**PARENT/CARER/TEACHER CONVERSATIONS.** At the beginning of each year, we provide time for parents/carers to have a conversation with their child's teacher. This allows us to better know students and build positive relationships. The conversations will be held on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> February and a Compass notification will be sent to all parents/carers to book a time between 1:00 and 6:00pm. It will include a questionnaire to complete and bring to the conversation.

**ANNOUNCING GRADE 6 LEADERSHIP POSITIONS AND WELCOMING OUR NEW PREPS.** We have renewed our Grade 6 Leadership Program to provide the following leadership opportunities for them.

• **School Captain:** Planning and leading assemblies, representing our school at special events (eg. ANZAC Day), being on call to show visitors about our school, modelling our school values.

- Vice-Captain: Stand in for School Captains or any other leadership roles, set up and run the presentation at assembly, answer the phone and greet visitors in the office if Colleen is out of the office, answer the phone in the portable, coordinate of lost property, modelling our school values.
- House Captains. Leading House activities, helping at the House Sports/Values Cup, running events for Houses during lunchtimes, modelling our school values.
- **Student Voice Captains.** Plan and lead termly student voice meetings with Home Group representatives to organise fundraising events and gain feedback from other students on how to improve the school, leading a review of the names of our Houses, modelling our school values.
- Values Captains. Attending Wellbeing Leadership Team meetings to set the weekly 'Value of the Week' for each term and assist review the school's School Wide Positive Behaviour Support Matrix, promote and model the school values (Respect, Responsibility, Kindness, Collaboration), present 'values' awards at Assembly.
- **Groundskeeper Captains.** On Monday mornings, see Colleen to put up the Australian and Aboriginal Flag and bring them back down on Friday afternoons, coordinate recess and lunchtime sporting equipment, rake the softfall in the playground, help ensure the grounds are free from rubbish, put buddy benches in/out each day, pack away and put-up the goal post pads each term, modelling our school values.

The Grade 6's will be informed of these opportunities and prepare speeches for these positions. They will then present their speeches to all Grade 3-6 students who will participate in an election to determine our Grade 6 student leaders. We will announce them at Assembly on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> February. At this Assembly we will also officially welcome the Preps to our school with the Grade 6s presenting the Preps with the Welcome Packs they have made for them.

**PARENT/CARER INFORMATION SESSION.** This will be held at 3:45pm on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> March to provide parents/carers a better understanding of the school. Please RSVP to Colleen in the office by Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> February.

**THANKS.** To James Gilbert (Grade 3) for organising an icy pole stall at home during the holidays. James raised \$73 which he has kindly donated to the school. After having a conversation about how he would like the school to use the money, we will use it to purchase some new books for students to read. We will spend \$4,073 on books this year.

**RIVERBANK MARKETS.** During the holidays, the school held two markets and a BIG thanks to all involved for giving their time to help ensure they ran successfully. Funds from these markets go towards our Art and Performing Arts/Music programs, so thanks for your assistance.

**IMPORTANT NOTIFICATION.** Anglesea Primary School is listed on the Bushfire at Risk Register (BARR) as a Category 2 School. On days when the Fire Danger Rating in our area is EXTREME, we will be CLOSED and staff will relocate to Torquay College P-6 in Grossmans Rd, Torquay. Parents will be given the option to take their children to Torquay College P-6 for the day. Please note, this only applies on EXTREME Days.

On days when the Fire Danger Rating in our area is CATASTROPHIC, Anglesea Primary School will be CLOSED. No relocation option is provided and families should enact their Bushfire Plan on these days.

If we are to be pre-emptively closed on either EXTREME or CATASTROPHIC days, we will notify you by text/email/Compass by approximately 2:00pm the previous day. Once declared that we will be closed, this will not change even if the weather or conditions alter overnight.

**UPDATING EXISTING ASTHMA / ANAPHYLAXIS PLANS.** For those children with Asthma/Anaphylaxis, each year we need an updated copy of childrens' Anaphylaxis and Asthma Action Plans signed by their medical practitioner. As it is parent/carer responsibility to provide the school with a copy of the updated plans, please ensure this is done ASAP.

**ANNUAL PRIVACY REMINDER.** Our school collects, uses, discloses and stores student and parent personal information for standard school functions or where permitted by law, as stated in the **Schools' Privacy Policy.** Please take time to remind yourself of the school's policy.



#### **Donation Requests**


Could we please request families donate a box of tissues for the learning space that their child/ren are in. Thank you.
