
Grade 1 - 2 : JRJ (Pandas) and JRU (Kookaburras)



We encourage every child to read for at least 20 minutes at home every day. This helps to build fluency, reading skills and strategies that your child is working on in class and also helps to foster a love for reading.

These are available to purchase from the office if required. Students who do not have a hat will need to remain under the covered spaces at recess and lunchtime.

Grade 5 and 6's Wellbeing

During our Wellbeing sessions, the 5/6s have been learning about emotions and how our emotions make our bodies feel. We have discussed how different scenarios can bring about different feelings for different people. Students have been learning how to use the Emotional Thermometer. which is a tool to help students put a name to their feelings and rate their intensity. The colours help students recognise each emotion, and the simple rating scales allows them to indicate how intensely they feel each one and is used to build emotional literacy. Once students are able to identify how they are feeling, they are able to come up with personal strategies to support them to regulate their emotions at each level of the Emotional Thermometer.




Outdoor Adventure Program Grade 6's Surfing


Year 3 and 4
