TEACHER PROFESSIONAL LEARNING. To challenge and extend student learning, this week teachers looked at how they design engaging Maths tasks using the four proficiencies of understanding, fluency, problem-solving and reasoning.

NETWORK CONFERENCE. On Tuesday and Wednesday I attended a conference with principals from the other 26 schools in our Network. Topics we discussed included student attendance and engagement, social and emotional learning, communities of principal practice (our focus is on improving teacher practice in Maths to improve student outcomes), meeting individual student need, numeracy improvement and planning for school improvement.

RIDE TO SCHOOL DAY. Well done and thanks to everyone for your participation. Hopefully it will encourage more students to ride to school more often.

SSA CROSS COUNTRY. This inter-school event will be held tomorrow in Geelong at Eastern Gardens for Grade 3-6 students. I'm sure our students will again demonstrate our school values by enjoying the challenge of the event and supporting each-other during the day.

NO ASSEMBLY. Assembly will not be held tomorrow due to the SSA Cross Country.

CURRICULUM DAYS (PUPIL FREE DAYS. MAY 8 AND OCTOBER 17). To enable teachers to increase engagement of students with complex, unmet learning needs and to successfully improve *all* students' self-regulation, relationships, wellbeing, growth and academic achievement our staff will attend Berry St training on Monday 8th May and Tuesday 17th October. To reduce costs, we will attend this training with staff from Aireys Inlet PS and Lorne P-12 College.






Can all students in the Pandas and Kookaburra learning groups please bring in a **shoe box** or alternate box of similar size for a special writing activity **this Friday** 31st.

Cross Country

Tomorrow (Friday 31st March), all grades 3-6 students will be travelling to Eastern Gardens in Geelong for the Surf Coast Schools Association (SSA) Cross Country. We encourage all students to attend the day and participation for students can vary from running the entire distance to walking or a combination of both. Rockets

Today the Victorian Space and Science Education Centre came to school and ran their "Reach for the Stars" program with Grades 3-6 students.

The grade 3/4 students had their sessions first thing in the morning and started by learning about how the rockets worked, designing then building rockets in small groups. They then took their rockets out to the oval to be launched. The grade 5/6 students participated in their sessions after recess and followed the same process.
