2024 PREPS AND BOOKWEEK DRESS UP DAY. Our first Prep Transition for 2024 prep students will be held tomorrow from 10-11:30am. Enrolment forms are due but can still be received. Friday 25th August is our Bookweek dress-up day and parade with our 2024 Preps and all students/staff invited to attend school dressed as a book character.

LEARNING. To challenge and extend student learning in reading and spelling, we teach phonics using a program called Sounds-Write. Sounds-Write is a very highly structured, incremental, code-oriented and instructional approach to teach children to read and spell. The program is implemented in all of our classrooms and provides fast and effective teaching for children at all levels. Miss Jay has engaged in professional development to implement this approach at our school and is coaching all of our teachers to use Sounds-Write in their classrooms. Earlier this year the school purchased multiple decodable readers that are being used during guided reading, shared writing, tutoring and independent reading times. We are also looking to replenish our home-readers ASAP.

WELLBEING. Every second Monday, Mitch from Bluearth visits us to conduct a 1-hour lesson with the children and teachers. Each session includes movement challenges, games and opportunities for reflection which promotes mindfulness and connection. On the alternate week, the teachers repeat the lesson with the children. All sessions utilise the Six Elements of the Bluearth Approach (Coordination and Agility, Core Movements, Dynamic Movement, Movement Challenges and Games, Moving in the Environment as well as Skill Activities.

VALUE OF THE WEEK. This week we are focusing on: Kindness – We behave in a safe manner. Next week we will focus on: Kindness – We are friendly and genuine.

They're Back

Dear Parents/Guardians/Carers,

It has come to my attention that some students in the school may have head lice and I seek your cooperation in checking your child's hair.

Head lice do not transmit infectious diseases – they are transmitted by having head to head contact with someone who has head lice. You may be reassured to know that head lice are commonly found in places other than at our school. Head lice are common in school-aged children and are the most adaptable of creatures. They have survived living solely on humans for 10,000 years!!!!

What can you do?

I seek your cooperation in checking your child's hair and in those instances where head lice or eggs are found, treating your child's hair. Please visit www.betterhealth.vic.gov.au and search for "head lice (nits)" for advice on finding, treating and preventing head lice.

If head lice or eggs are found on your child's hair you need to inform:

- *the school and advise when the treatment has started
- *parents or carers of your child's friends so they too have the opportunity to detect and treat their children if necessary.

When can my child return to school?

Health regulations requires that where a child has head lice, that child should not return to school until the day after appropriate treatment has started. Please note, this refers only to those children who have live head lice and does not refer to head lice eggs. More information about exclusion requirements can be found by searching for "school exclusion table" at www.health.vic.gov.au.

Anglesea Primary School is aware that head lice can be a sensitive issue and is committed to maintaining your confidentiality.

Assistance for families with uniform/shoe purchases:

Who is eligible?

State Schools' Relief provides support to any Victorian student attending a government school (primary, secondary or specialist), on the advice of the school. Schools are able to submit an application directly, via our online portal, whenever they believe there is a need to support a student whose family/carers are facing difficulty in providing the appropriate uniform, footwear or educational items for attending school.

- Situations include, but are not limited to:
- Unemployment
- Health issues/illness
- Financial difficulties
- Independent living and/or homelessness
- · Natural disasters, house fires
- Bereavement
- Domestic violence

All applications are processed within 24 - 48 hours and you will receive confirmation of application/s by email. Orders will then be delivered within 4 working days.
