PRINCIPAL'S COLUMN

School Values: Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Collaboration.

RIVERBANK MARKET. Thanks to parent Kate Stanley and teachers Duncan Lester and Lachlan Turner for marking the site locations after school on Friday. Thanks also to parents Luke Grundy, Sandy Palmer, Fiona Saw, Steph Ross, Ellen Harper, Brooke Powell and Mike Bodsworth for assisting at the Market and to Kip Graham for being our First Aid officer. You might not know that Colleen in the office completes a huge amount of work for our Riverbank Markets, including taking all site bookings and administrative tasks. In the foyer of the school is a roster as we are asking for volunteers to help at our New Years Day market (9am-4:00pm) and Twilight Market on January 14 (3-8:30pm).

OPEN AFTERNOON AND SEESAW. It was terrific to see so many parents/carers in the school last Friday to view some of the students' work. I hope parents/carers also enjoyed viewing some of their children's work via Seesaw.

MATHS VISIT. Tomorrow 18 principals and teachers from nearby schools will visit us to observe our approach to teaching maths. Their visit will focus on observing our Maths Workshop Model (how we teach Maths) to challenge and extend student learning and improve our student achievement data. For example, in 2019 22% of Grade 5 students achieved in the Top 2 Bands for Numeracy (NAPLAN), this figure increased to 35% in 2021 and 36% in 2022 (both above like schools). Our Maths Leaders, Mr Lester and Mr Turner, will share how we support our teachers to improve their teaching as well as the assessment techniques, learning tasks and resources used to challenge and extend students.

SCHOOL COUNCIL. We met yesterday, below is a summary:

- We listened to and supported a proposal to upgrade our Basketball stadium and outdoor court. The proposal will be used to source funding for the upgrade.
- The following policies were approved and will soon appear on our website: Visitors, First Aid, Parent Payments, Yard Duty and Supervision, Personal Property.
- We looked at the results from the iPad/ICT surveys that parents/carers, students and staff completed.
- We would like to thank the Parents Club for organising the Spooky Disco. Our Parents Club are again meeting next week to continue planning for our Village Fair in March next year.

SUMMARY OF IPAD/ICT SURVEY DATA.

- Of the 40 parents/carers who completed the survey, 11 were unaware of our whole school approach to iPads/ICT. Please note if a family of a student in Grade 4, 5 and 6 does not have their own Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) iPad, the school provides one for school use.
- When asked if the BYOD program should remain as is, this was supported by the Gr 3/6 students and staff. Parent/carer reaction was mixed between the BYOD program continuing and the school providing devices.
- The Grade 3-6 students prefer to have a 1:1 device (a device each) rather than having to share devices. When questioned about this, they prefer not having to wait for specific times of the day/week to access a device to help complete their school work.
- The Grade 4-6 students feel they should be able to take their BYOD iPad home each night. The majority of parents/carers said they'd prefer for iPads to remain at school each night. Please note that parents/carers are able to request the iPad stays at school.
- The staff listed how the iPads are used at school. Researching information, Literacy apps, Numeracy apps, Essential assessment (to assist determine student's strengths and future learning goals), Typing writing/stories, Viewing information via the Apple TV, Sharing learning/projects via the Apple TV, Apps related to the Grade 5+6 CFA project and Making music during Music lessons.

ATTENDANCE. Recently DET sent me a list of 101 students who were at risk of chronic absence (missed 15+ days of school this year). I understand illness and family holidays is a contributor. If your child is absent, please submit the reasons on Compass so we have a full and clear picture when analysing attendance data. As always, we want students at school every day.

REMEMBRANCE DAY. Next Friday our Grade 6 students will attend the Anglesea RSL ceremony at the new War Memorial.

PREP TRANSITION. Next Friday our 2023 Preps will attend their 4th transition session at school from 10-11:30am. **ASSEMBLY.** Assembly will be held at 3pm in the Stadium tomorrow – all welcome.

Below are some examples of what the students are planning to paint on their fence palings.















Students really enjoy adding items to Seesaw. Thank you to the parents who have added such positive feedback with what students were most proud of this year.




Cummings, students wrote their own persuasive letters with the
