PRINCIPAL'S COLUMN

School Values: Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Collaboration.

TERM 4. This term we will continue to focus on our three priorities:

- Learning to challenge and extend student learning: Continuing to implement the Professional Learning Community (PLC) approach; Maths leaders coaching teachers to improve students' numeracy skills; implementing Sounds Write being to improve students' literacy skills
- Wellbeing Gardening with ANGAIR, Outdoor Learning opportunities, Parents Club 'Spooky Disco'.
- Strengthen home-school communication: Seesaw and Open Afternoon for parents/carers to view student work; Parent information sessions (classroom helpers and iPad/ICT); End of year parent/carer/teacher discussions.

GARDENING WITH ANGAIR. Many thanks to ANGAIR and GORCAPA for teaching the children on Tuesday about the plants/animals/insects/wildlife that can be found in our grounds. They made comment about how our Grade 6 students, who assisted them to teach the younger children, were so enthusiastic and spoke with kindness. This is usually an annual event, but due to COVID has not been held since 2019.

CLASSROOM HELPERS SESSION. This was held on Tuesday and thanks to the nine parents/carers for attending.

PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE DAY. On the last day of Term 3 all staff attended Sounds Write professional learning to improve our teaching of reading, writing and spelling. Thanks to Miss Jay and Miss G for facilitating this day.

MINI FETE AND FOOTY COLOURS DAY. Thanks to everyone for making this day a success with lots of fun, and learning about money, being had. Thanks to our Student Voice leaders, who along with Mr Lester, planned and led the Mini Fete which raised \$2,305.15. These funds will go towards a project as determined by our Student Voice leaders. The footy colours day raised \$274.30 for Fight Cancer Foundation.

OUT OF SCHOOL HOURS CARE (OSHC) BBQ FUNDRAISER. This was held at the ANGAIR Art Show and raised \$992 for our OSHC program. Many thanks to parent, Sandy Martin, for all his time and effort to support the fundraiser. Thanks also to the many other parents for giving their time to assist.

SSA JUNIOR (PREP – 2) ATHLETICS. This is scheduled for Wednesday 12th October. Like previous years, parents/carers are required to organise transport for their child/ren to and from Landy Field. Further information about this event can be found in another section of this newsletter.

PARENT/CARER INFORMATION SESSION – iPads/ICT. This will be held at school today from 4-4:30pm.

NEW PLAYGROUND. As announced on Monday, we will receive \$200,000 for an Inclusive Playground to promote inclusive and innovative practices to better support all children, including those with disabilities or additional needs. The playground should be completed mid/late 2023. To gain these funds, we submitted a very comprehensive grant application. Earlier this year I called for volunteers (parents/community members) to assist complete the application. Thanks to Scott Rankin, Amy Clemens, Mike Bodsworth, the Surf Coast Shire, the Buildings and Grounds sub-committee of school council, the school council as well as Claire Paterson and her father for giving their time and expertise to what will achieve a great outcome for all school.

OTHER GRANTS. We have received \$20,000 of the \$25,000 via the School Shade Sails fund to install a verandah and deck (15m x 4m) to the western side on the Grade 5+6 classroom, which will hopefully be installed over the summer holiday period. We are waiting the outcome of another shade sail grant worth \$25,000, submitted to the Cancer Council, to install an outdoor gazebo over the outdoor seating in the vegetable garden.

CAMPS.

- Somers Camp. Eight of our Grade 5 and 6 students will attend this camp from Tuesday 29/11 to Wednesday 7/12.
- Licola Camp. We have an opportunity to send three children from Grade 6 to the Licola Camp. There is no cost involved as the Anglesea Lions Club is funding places for two students and the Anglesea Lionettes one place. Expression of Interest forms were sent home again this week to parents/carers of Grade 6 students as they are due back at school tomorrow.

LONG SERVICE LEAVE. I am taking 10 days leave, commencing Tuesday 11th October to return on Tuesday 25th October. Replacing me as Acting Principal will be Fleur Kukler.

Wellbeing week focus - Cyber Safety



This week students in Senior G, Senior V, Senior A and Senior LT have begun our new online safety program, Cyber Echo program developed **by Bravehearts** that is designed specifically for children in years 3 to 6 to learn about communicating safely and respectfully online. **Cyber**

Echo teaches students key strategies about staying safe online, covering everything from social networking through to protecting personal information and how to create a positive digital footprint. Developed in partnership with Google Australia, The Australian Federal Police and aligned to the National Curriculum, Cyber Echo is a highly regarded, blended learning program for the teaching of cyber-safety. Cyber Echo has been designed to be compatible across multiple devices, incorporating lessons both offline and online in a learning management system that allows for teacher-directed, interactive activities and online assessment that is managed by the classroom teacher. The slogan, 'What you share will always be there' underpins the program and each lesson teaches children key strategies to help keep them safe online. Cyber Echo aims to raise awareness of online safety issues as

well as building and reinforcing skills, attitudes and behavioural traits for positive online interaction by addressing online relationships versus real-life relationships, social networking, online grooming, protecting personal information, mechanisms for reporting, communicating positively online and creating a positive digital footprint.





Junior Athletics Day Wednesday October 12, 2022

Next Wednesday the Junior cohort will have their first Athletics Day at Landy Field in Geelong. The students will participate in high jump, long jump, hop skip jump and run, hurdles, cricket ball throw and running events. The schools in our local sports association (Aireys, Moriac, Mirripoa, Mt Duneed, Moriac, Ceres and Winchelsea) will also be competing. The students have been preparing for these

events in PE. Please check that you have approved and paid for this excursion. This can be done through Compass. You can approve in Compass and pay with BPAY or cash or do both in Compass.(If you are paying with cash or BPAY just mark payment in compass as using credit)

Parents/carers are required to organise their own transport for their child/ren to and from Landy

<u>Field.</u> Please ensure that your child/ren are at Landy Field by **9.30am** and assembled in the grandstand. Look for the teal-coloured Anglesea PS teardrop banner. The first event will **commence at 9.45am** and the day will conclude at **approximately 2:15pm** with the students dismissed following presentations. School families are welcome to attend the sports day. We do need parent volunteers to assist in the transition of students between events and with the running of our allocated event, the hop, skip, jump and run. If you can help, please let your child's homeroom teacher know.

- Students need to bring a packed lunch, snacks, sunscreen, and a refillable water bottle. There are no canteen facilities at the event.
- Students are required to wear their school polo shirt, running shorts and suitable running shoes.

 They are advised to bring warm clothing and a weatherproof jacket to wear when not competing.
 - The day will go ahead unless it is raining. There is currently no back-up day due to the booking guidelines with Landy Field. In the event of inclement weather, the cancellation of the sports will be announced on KRock at 7:30am. Additionally, parents/carers will be advised through Compass.
- All students are to be signed in on arrival, and prior to departing Landy Field. Please see your child's home group teacher to do this.
- Parents/carers should not take their child/ren after the last individual event unless the child's card has been collected by the school running the event.
- The focus of the day is on participation and all students will be expected to participate in as many events as possible.

Bluearth

Spring was in the air this week when Mitch was here to guide us in Bluearth. We challenged ourselves to use equipment we already have at school and practised balancing on the stadium ramp handles which is harder than it looks! We then used the outdoor seats to extend our comfort zone and try a variety of
