PRINCIPAL'S COLUMN

School Values: Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Collaboration.

BUSHFIRE PREPAREDNESS. As we approach the bushfire danger period, please make some time to read the following documents:

- <u>Anglesea PS. Communications to community on fire preparation for category 1-2 schools.</u> This explains the procedures we will follow in the event of Catastrophic or Extreme weather conditions.
- Catastrophic Weather Conditions if declared for our Central fire district (Surf Coast Shire), we are closed.
- Extreme Weather Conditions if declared in our local government area (Surf Coast Shire), we relocate to Torquay College (P-6). The Education Department, along with other emergency service groups, decided Extreme weather will be based on Local Government Area rather than the Central Fire District, as the weather within a District can be different. For example, the Central District ranges from us here at Anglesea (where we might experience a sea breeze) to areas north of Melbourne (where they might experience strong northerly winds).
- Anglesea PS. Extreme weather conditions. Process for students, parents and staff. This explains the procedures
 we will follow, being we relocate to Torquay College (P-6). I ask all families to please complete a short survey
 by 3pm on Wednesday 11th October to give the school an indication regarding how many students will

- <u>EXAMPLE Letter confirming relocation to Torquay College P-6.</u> If we are to relocate to Torquay College (P-6) due to Extreme weather, everyone will receive an edited version of this document via Compass by 2:00pm the day prior.

If I need to send these documents to families and staff, it will be via Compass notification. If you haven't already, I strongly suggest you install the Compass app on your mobile phone allowing you to receive notifications immediately.

After you have read these documents, please contact me if you have any queries. I'd also like all families to complete a short survey so we have an indication of how many students will relocate to Torquay College (P-6) if Extreme weather conditions are announced for our Local Government Area, the Surf Coast Shire

COMMUNITY EVENT. Last year the school received a \$2,000 grant via the Surf Coast Shire's Climate Emergency Community Initiative. Most of these funds were used to allow parents/carers use eBikes free of charge for a two-week

period to shift travel behaviours as well as attitudes, habits and social norms around how students, parents and carers view active travel to kinder, school and work and get around Anglesea. Some of the funding was earmarked to hold an inclusive community event to raise awareness around how community can get involved in local community action on climate change. This will be held on Monday 30th October from 1:30-2:30pm – more details to come.

VILLAGE FAIR. Please find attached to this newsletter a document titled 'VF 2024 Organising Team Support'. It contains important information about next year's Fair, as we need volunteers for it to be held. Please respond by the end of October.

- Bereavement
- · Domestic violence

All applications are processed within 24 - 48 hours and you will receive confirmation of application/s by email. Orders will then be delivered within 4 working days.


