We have no tolerance for child abuse and take proactive steps to identify and manage any risks of harm to students in our school environments. Particular attention is given to the child safety needs of Aboriginal students, those from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, international students, students with disabilities, those unable to live at home, children and young people who identify as LGBTIQ+ and other students experiencing risk or vulnerability. Child safety is a shared responsibility.

2025 FOUNDATION (PREP) ENROLMENTS AND OPEN DAY.

The Department of Education has released a new statewide Foundation (Prep) enrolment timeline. The timeline advises families when and how to enrol their child into Foundation (Prep) at a Victorian government primary school, including Anglesea Primary School.

The new timeline will apply for children starting Foundation (Prep) in 2025. All government primary schools will follow the new timeline in 2024 to support Foundation (Prep) enrolments for the 2025 school year.

You will be able to apply to enrol your child in Foundation (Prep) 2025 at Anglesea Primary School **from 15 April 2024**.

You will be notified of the outcome of your application **between Monday 29 July and Friday 9 August 2024**. If you receive an enrolment offer, you should contact our school to accept the offer by **Friday 23 August 2024**.

Take part in enrolment information and transition sessions during Term 3 and 4, 2024. Details to come.

Your child will start Foundation (Prep) from **29 January 2025**.

Enrolment applications submitted after 26 July 2024 will be processed by our school as they are received, in accordance with the department's Placement Policy.

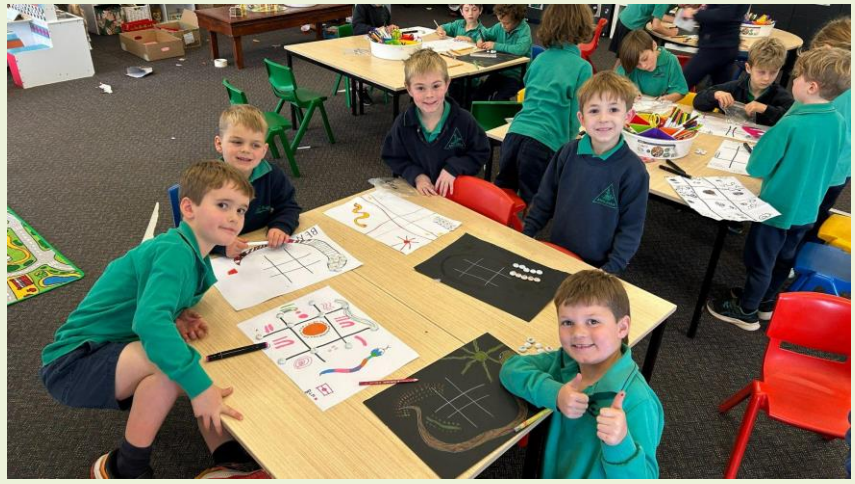
YARD DUTY ROSTER:

Grades Five & Six Excursion



Thursday June 20th

Students in Senior A and Senior S will travel by bus to participate in two free sessions at Belmont High School. The bus will leave at 9am and return to school before 3.30. Students will need to bring recess, lunch and a refillable drink bottle.

Session 1. Beat that

Beat That will take students on a wonderful journey through the fascinating world of the human cardiovascular system, focusing on the heart and circulatory system. Beat That introduces applications of medical technologies and exercise science equipment. Students will learn about the cardiovascular system, collect and analyse their own heart rate data using graphs, and mathematical analysis techniques. Through the use of data logging technology, students will participate in an experimental investigation which will allow them to analyse and interpret primary data.

Session 2. What makes me tick

What Makes Me Tick will take students on an adventure into the human body looking at several important components such as cells, DNA, the skeletal, muscular and nervous systems. Students work in small groups with mentors to perform chemistry experiments, problem solve and utilise scientific technology such as microscopes, micropipettes and 3D models.
