Congratulations to those students who have achieved their '100 nights of reading' certificate and sticker. Your persistence is amazing and we love hearing your reading progress!

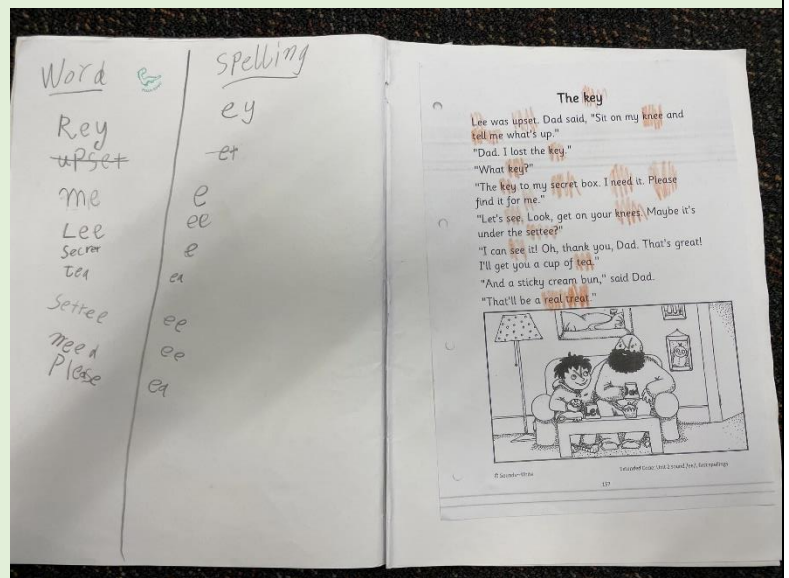
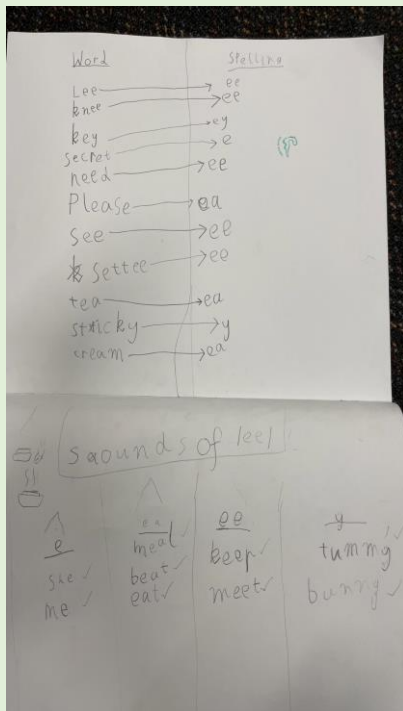


Lost property/Missing items

Wellbeing

This week in Wellbeing the Grade 5 and 6's built their own wellbeing Kit. The kit had to include breathing strategies, meditation experiences and physical practices that could all be used to help regulate their emotions when they become heightened. The students also looked into an appropriate song that they can listen to that helps them to regulate their emotions when they are heightened or upset. Finally the wellbeing kit had an inspirational quote that resonated with each student in an uplifting way. It was great to see all the students so passionate about creating a wellbeing kit that would help them regulate their emotions.

Reading

This week, Senior A and Senior L students have continued to make inferences while reading non-fiction texts. The aim of inferring is to give the reader a deeper understanding of what they are reading by encouraging students to go beyond the surface details to see other meanings that the details suggest or imply. It has been really pleasing to see the students use language and illustrations from texts they are reading to make their own inferences.
