PRINCIPAL'S COLUMN

School Values: Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Collaboration.

GRADE 3+4 CAMP. Well done to students and staff for what was a very enjoyable Camp. The children are to be congratulated for their behaviour, their willingness to give things a go (eg. the Giant Swing) and for supporting each other. Thanks to the staff for attending and taking great care for the children whilst being away from their families. To the parents/carers, thanks for dropping off and picking up the children on time and for helping them pack their bags.

MINI FETE AND END OF TERM. Term 3 concludes next Friday with our Mini Fete from 10am to 12:30pm (see information in another section of this newsletter) followed by the end of term dismissal at 2:30pm.

SCHOOL COUNCIL. We met yesterday and below is a summary:

- Lunch Orders. We approved an expression of interest process to provide lunch orders. The expression of interest documentation will be placed on our website, advertised in the newsletter (see below) and sent to local businesses.
- Basketball. Recently the Surf Coast Basketball Association (SBA) announced Anglesea PS as a venue to play Basketball games after school, which we support. We are waiting to hear the next steps from the SBA.
- The Village News. Each year we produce and distribute a school magazine, The Village News. It contains articles and photos describing the years highlights. If anyone would like to help in its production, please contact me.
- Working Bee. On Tuesday next week (September 13) we are asking parents/carers/community members to come to school at 3:30pm to help the Buildings and Grounds sub-committee complete three key tasks:
 - Install a new flagpole at the front of the school to fly the Torres Strait Islander flag.
 - Take rubbish (eg. Broken/vandalised soccer goals) to the Anglesea tip.
 - Place doors on children's lockers that don't have one. Please bring a cordless drill.
- We discussed Soundwrite (spelling, reading and writing program) and agreed to include information about it in the newsletter (see below).

- Village Fair. We agreed to seek volunteers to help plan next years Village Fair. In the past, funds raised from this event have resulted in the installation of shade sails over the playground, books being purchased for the children to read, a roof being installed over the bike shed, purchasing Art and Music resources and the purchase of new furniture for the children (desks and tables). If you would like to assist, please see Twiggy (parent) or myself.
- Christmas Raffle. Next term we will ask for donations for a Christmas raffle. Funds raised will be used to purchase more new books for the children to read. If you would like to assist, please see Twiggy (parent) or myself.

SOUNDSWRITE. To challenge and extend student learning in reading and spelling, we teach phonics using a program called Sounds-Write. Sounds-Write is a very highly structured, incremental, code-oriented and instructional approach to teach children to read and spell. The program is implemented in all of our classrooms and provides fast and effective teaching for children at all levels. Ms Jay has engaged in professional development to implement this approach at our school and is coaching all of our teachers to use Sounds-Write in their classrooms. Earlier this year the school purchased multiple decodable readers that are being used during guided reading, shared writing, tutoring and independent reading times.

NEW HOME READERS. This week we took delivery of \$2,500 worth of books for the children to use for home reading. Thanks to Ms Jay for purchasing the books, which will now be labelled before the children take them home from early next term. I hope they enjoy reading these books and return them in good condition for others to enjoy.

HATS. Our Sun Protection Policy states that from 1 September to 30 April, students must wear a hat that shades the face, neck and ears for all outdoor activities. We will encourage the children to wear hats this week. Parents/carers are asked to ensure their children have an appropriate hat from Monday 11th September when we will begin 'No Hat, No Play', meaning anyone without a hat will need to stay out of the sun in a designated shade area. Hats are available from the office for \$9.50.

THANK YOU. We are always very appreciative of the support we gain from parents/carers and community groups.

- Thank you to parent Ryan Long for organising transport of our third flagpole from Melbourne to Anglesea. Thanks also to the Anglesea Community Bank for providing a grant allowing us to purchase the flagpole and Torres Strait Islander flag.
- To parent Luke Grundy for installing the Mosaic on the fence in the vegetable garden. Also, for giving his time to make our playground safer.

All applications are processed within 24 - 48 hours and you will receive confirmation of application/s by email. Orders will then be delivered within 4 working days.

Mini Fete is happening on the last day of term (Friday 15th September) and we are now preparing our stalls ready for the day! This year the Juniors are running the following stalls:

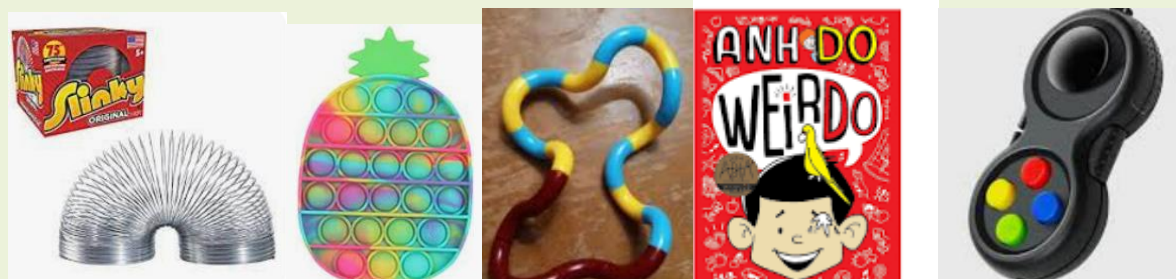

Many of our children are struggling with worry and anxiety.

They may face social and online challenges and can often feel stuck. As parents, we can find this difficult to help our children, as they confront issues so different to the ones we faced at a similar age.

We want to help our adolescents to build their resilience, so when they encounter new challenges, they can tackle them with more confidence. This workshop is designed to help parents teach their children to be more resilient while building their independence. It will give parents simple and practical ideas to help their children, while developing strong, loving, and connected relationships.

BRINGING UP GREAT KIDS

The First 1000 Days

The first 1,000 days of life is a program for parents with children aged under 2 years and designed to nurture parents as they embark on their journey. It provides parents with knowledge about brain development and an understanding of how children grow and what they need. The centrality of family relationships and opportunities for parents to reflect on their own childhood and how to connect with their children are all explored.

BRINGING UP GREAT KIDS

Bringing up Great Kids is a 6-week supportive program for parents of children aged 12 months to 9 years.

The program aims to:

- develop parents' skills to enhance communication with their children;
- promote positive interactions between parents and their children;
- encourage the development of a child's positive self-identity.

CIRCLE OF SECURITY

Circle of Security is an 8-week supportive program for parents of children aged birth to 5 years.

The program aims to:

- help parents understand how to build feelings of security for children in their early years;
- assist parents with skills to build on the positive relationship with their child;
- develop confidence in parents to respond to their child in a way which builds a secure foundation for children.

TUNING IN TO KIDS

Tuning in to kids is a 6-week supportive program for parents of children aged 4 to 10 years.

The program aims to:

- help parents teach and support their child/ren to understand and manage their emotions;
- support parents in encouraging children to express emotions appropriately;
- maximise children's social, behavioural and learning outcomes.

BRINGING UP GREAT KIDS

Parenting Adolescents

The program builds on maintaining positive relationships and interactions between parents and adolescents during the ages of 10 to 17 years. This 6-week program will look at having a better understanding and being able to support your adolescent.

- Finding meaningful ways to stay connected with you adolescent;
- Understand that all behaviour and interaction have a meaning attached to it;
- Develop an increased understanding about the messages that they communicate to their adolescent through their behaviour, actions and attitudes;
- Develop skills to identify and manage their stress associated with parenting.

STEPPING STONES

Stepping Stones is a 5-week program for families with a child who has a disability. The program aims to help parents use Positive Parenting to acquire new skills and knowledge. Skills are practiced and parents receive constructive feedback about their use of skills.

OUR KIDS – Parenting After Separation

Our Kids is a 6-week course on parenting after separation and the impact of parental conflict on children. The course encourages parents to focus on the needs of their children and develop helpful communication strategies following separation. Courses run weekly for 6 weeks during school terms. Morning and evening sessions are available.

THE DAD WORKSHOP

This 6-week program will focus on giving you the tools you need to create a better life for your entire family.

We will look at simple things you can do to improve:

- your relationship with yourself;
- your relationship with your partner;
- your relationship with your kids.

FLOURISHING FAMILIES

A 5-week program for parents with children of all ages to discover how you can help your family to flourish.

Learn about:

- how you can promote resilience;
- increase awareness of your family's strengths;
- create and nurture positive family relationships;
- give feedback to support individual growth.

BUBS TO TOTS

Bubs to Tots brings mothers (up to 24 years) of children in the 1 to 2 year age group together for support and education.

NO MORE SCAREDY CATS

Reducing Anxiety and Building Resilience in Children

A 4-week program for parents of children 5 to 12 years to gain an understanding of the increasing levels of anxiety in a child and strategies to help manage the "traps and tripwires" with strengthening sayings, questioning strategies and mindful exercises.

TUNING IN TO TEENS

Tuning in to teens is a 6-week supportive program for parents of teens aged 12 to 18 years.

The program aims to:

- support parents to connect and communicate with their teens;
- assist parents with understanding adolescent development;
- help parents to assist their teen to develop emotional intelligence;
- remain empathetic and stay connected.

LIVING WITH TEENS

A model for building strong, secure connections. Living with Teens is a 3-week program.

The program aims to cover:

- what parents need to be able to meet teen's needs;
- what teens need from parents;
- adolescent development.

BUMPS TO BUBS

Bumps to Bubs brings young mothers and mothers-to-be (up to 23 years) with babies 0 to 1 year, together to support the journey of parenting.

DADS TUNING INTO KIDS

Dads Tuning into Kids is a 6-week supportive program specifically for Dads of children aged 3 to 12 years.

The program aims to:

- help dads to effectively tune in to their child's emotions;
- encourage dads to strengthen their emotional connection with their child;
- support dads to build skills in emotion coaching to assist their child's individual needs.
