## PRINCIPAL’S COLUMN

**ILLNESS.** I hope our unwell students/parents/carers make a speedy recovery. As some of our wonderful staff have been dealing with COVID-19 themselves. I hope they also make a speedy recovery. Thanks to our families for their patience and understanding when staff are absent. Thanks also to the staff at school for being flexible whilst other staff are unwell.

**STUDENT REPORTS AND PARENT TEACHER CONVERSATIONS.** Currently our teaching staff are writing the June 2022 student reports. Due to this term being only nine weeks, rather than the usual ten and we’ve got a busy end to the term with the Juniors excursion to Werribee Zoo and Grade 5+6 camp, we’ve scheduled to share the reports with parents/carers (via Compass) in the last week of term 2. In the first week of Term 3 parents/carers will receive information (via Compass) about how to book a time to discuss the report with their child’s teacher, which are scheduled for the second week of Term 3.

**CLIMATE ACTION GRANT OF \$5,000.** Many thanks to parents Tim Marriage and Marcelle Renkin for assisting the school to write a Climate Action Grant (Ride the Change) that was available through the Surf Coast Shire. After submitting the grant application, on Sunday we had the opportunity to present further details of our proposal at the Surf Coast Shire offices. Shortly after our presentation, we were informed that our grant application was successful! Thanks to Tim for his efforts to prepare and deliver our presentation and for Marcelle for being present to offer support. Also to parents/carers and staff for voting for our proposal! Our grant application had 3 components, being:

### 1. E-Cargo Bike trial via subscription service Lug-and-Carrie

(<https://www.lug-carrie.com>)

- Give families at Anglesea Primary School an opportunity to trial a Lug-and-Carrie E-Cargo bike for 2 weeks and challenge them to use it for their daily school run
- Measure the kilometres travelled during the trial
- Families will get an induction session covering safe operation and care of bike
- Bikes come insured for damage and theft
- Individual families will sign a rental agreement directly with Lug-and Carrie
- A similar program run by Lug-and-Carrie with Moreland City Council found that 50% of families decided to continue using the service at the end of the 2-week trial. (<https://www.lug-carrie.com/post/a-successful-partnership-with-moreland-city-council>)



### 2. Artist Collaboration with Anglesea Primary School students

- We will employ Anglesea artist, Mivart (<https://www.mivart.com.au>), to work with Anglesea Primary School students to produce a series of colouring pages around the theme: "On my ride today..."
- Mivart has extensive experience collaborating with schools. She also has a personal passion for raising environmental awareness through Art

### 3. Ride the Change Cycling Event

- Held on Earth Day 2023
- Community focussed cycling event that explores the secret landmarks of Anglesea that are only accessible by bike.

On Tuesday, the students worked on 'Place Value' jigsaw puzzles. These puzzles were created by teachers and work like a jigsaw. The students worked in pairs, they needed to find a strategy for solving the puzzle and put it together as best they could. Most students' strategy was to find the pattern the numbers were increasing or decreasing by on each piece and used that knowledge to solve the jigsaw. Below are some photos of the students working collaboratively to solve the puzzles.



### **Reading**

This week in the 5/6s students have continued to learn about the Reading Power strategy 'Inferring'. Inferring requires readers to use prior knowledge and the information stated in a text to draw their own conclusions. The students have read short nonfiction texts based on our Inquiry topic 'The Gold Rush', which is linked to our camp at Sovereign Hill in the last week of term. Students have completed OWIs (Observe, Wonder, Infer), where the students pick a sentence from the text, record a wondering about the sentence and make an inference by using their own knowledge of the topic and what the text says.

### **Minecraft Education Edition – Mathematics and Inquiry**



A reminder to parents' of 5/6 students to please check your child's device to see if they have the app 'Minecraft Education Edition'. This app was 'pushed out' to student devices last Thursday. If it has not yet reached your child's device, can you please let your homegroup teacher know, or alternatively, download the app from the app store (An image of the logo is below). We are planning on using this in our Mathematics and Inquiry sessions, it will help lessons to run smoothly if the students already have the app. Your child

will only be able to access this app with teacher permission, as teachers are keeping the usernames and passwords.

We encourage every child to read for at least 20 minutes at home every day. This helps to build fluency, reading skills and strategies that your child is working on in class and also helps to foster a love for reading.

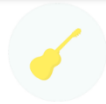
