## PRINCIPAL'S COLUMN

### OUR SCHOOL VALUES: Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Collaboration.

**RETURN TO ONSITE LEARNING.** It was terrific to see the children back at school on Wednesday. Our priorities for coming weeks are to focus on:

- Student wellbeing, by supporting the children to make a positive return to school.
- Student learning, by re-establishing school routines and teaching and learning practices.

**UPDATED OPERATIONS GUIDE.** The Department of Education and Training (DET) has released an updated Operations Guide. Below are the main points:

- School camps and overnight stays can take place across Victoria when limited to single schools.
  - Our Grade 3+4 Camp will now be held from Monday 9<sup>th</sup> August to Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> August.
  - Our Grade 2 Camp will now be held from Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> September to Friday 10<sup>th</sup> September.
- Non-essential visitors should be excluded from school sites for this period. Essential visitors include:
  - Preservice teacher placements
  - Staff involved in School Breakfast Clubs
  - Health and wellbeing staff
- Community groups are not permitted to use school facilities during school hours (indoor or outdoor). When used outside of school hours, a density limit of 1 person per 4 square meters must be applied to the spaces used.
  - Due to cleaning requirements, we are unable to let community groups use the Stadium.
- School tours should not be conducted on-site for prospective students and their families at this time.
- Non-essential meetings, and all school events, gatherings and assemblies should be deferred or held remotely.
  - Our Assembly will continue to be held via WebEx video-conference.
- Kinder to prep and Year 6 to Year 7 transition programs are not permitted at this time.
- The School Breakfast Clubs program is an essential service that can be delivered on-site.
- Lunch orders can resume.

**TEACHER PROFESSIONAL LEARNING (DEVELOPMENT).** Last week I mentioned how our teachers are continuing to attend a range of professional learning to improve their practice to then improve student outcomes. Additional professional learning our staff have completed include:

- Managing Challenging Behaviours (student wellbeing)
- Prevent-Teach-Reteach (student wellbeing)
- Day 2 of Professional Learning Communities (student learning)
- All Play Learn (inclusive Education)

**PARENTS CLUB WINTER GALA.** At this stage all plans for the Winter Gala are progressing and we are hoping this event will still be held on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> August.

**2021 PARENT/CAREGIVER/GUARDIAN OPINION SURVEY.** Our school is conducting a survey from Monday 19<sup>th</sup> July to Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> August to find out what parents/caregivers/guardians think of our school. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, student engagement and experiences of remote and flexible learning. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies. The survey will be conducted online, all responses are anonymous, only takes 20 minutes to complete and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones.

#### Bully Busters - How can we make up with our friends

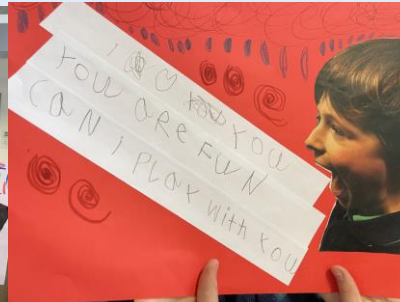

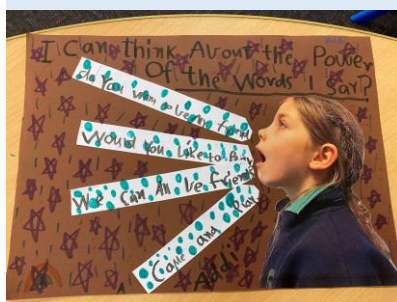

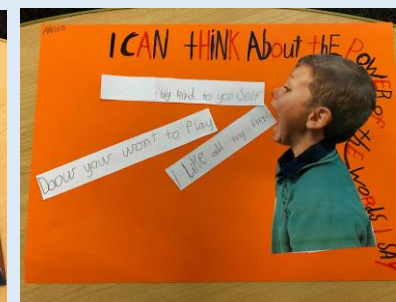

### **Year 3/4 Camp - Reminder**

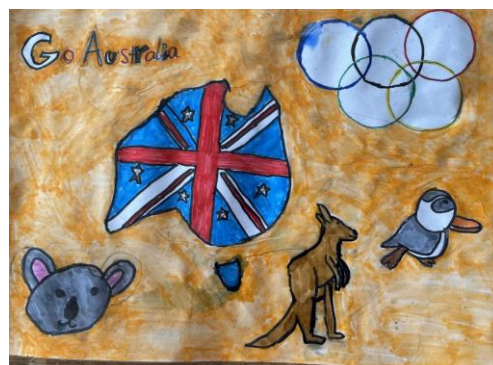
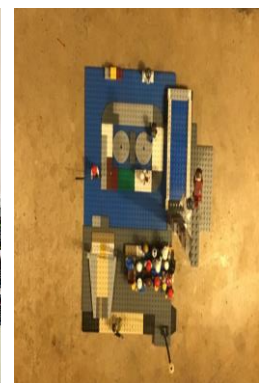

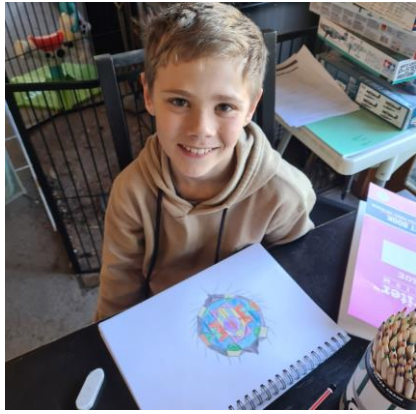

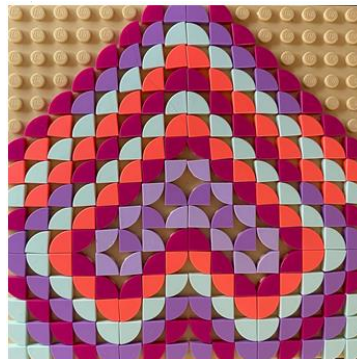
