PRINCIPAL'S COLUMN

OUR SCHOOL VALUES: Respect, Responsibility, Kindness and Collaboration.

RETURN TO ONSITE LEARNING. It will be great to see the Grade Prep-2 students return to school tomorrow along with their teachers and aides. Our cleaners have done a great job to make sure everything is clean, and our gardeners were here today to make sure the grounds are looking magnificent. It will be great to have some children and staff back at school. A reminder about the restrictions:

- In the morning, students are to walk through one of the gates by themselves.
- Parents/carers/visitors are to not come into the school grounds unless absolutely necessary.
- Parents/carers/visitors are to not come into the school buildings at all.
- The children are welcome to wear a face mask if they wish.
- Staff will be wearing face masks except when teaching the children.
- All school iPads that have been borrowed by students in Grade Prep-2 need to be returned to school.
- Adults must follow social distancing protocols of keeping at least 1.5m apart and wear a face mask.
- At the end of the school day, parents/carers of Prep – 2 students can wait for their children outside the Café area. The Junior teachers will walk the children to this area. Again, parents/carers are asked to keep at least 1.5m apart and wear a face mask.

REMOTE AND FLEXIBLE LEARNING. Our Grade 3-6 students and staff continue with Remote and Flexible Learning, and we hope they will be back for on-site learning soon.

FOOTY COLOURS DAY. Next Thursday (September 18) students and staff are invited to wear their footy colours. Of course, I expect to see many in the blue and white hoops as the Cats march on to another premiership!

SCHOOL EVENTS UPDATE. Due to COVID restrictions, please note the following:

- The Grade 2 Camp scheduled for Thursday 9th and Friday 10th September is postponed and we hope to organise a new date.
- Hopefully we will be able to hold Prep Transition 4 on Friday 15th October.
- The Grade 3+4 History Box incursion scheduled for Thursday 9th September has been postponed.

COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS. The Department of Education and Training (DET) is due to release a new Operations Guide. As this is yet to be received, the use of school facilities by community and sporting groups is not permitted.

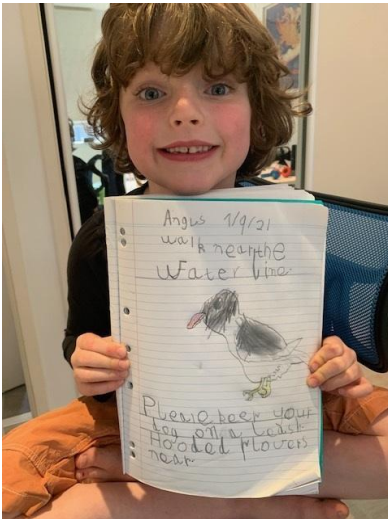
JUNIOR LEARNING COMMUNITY

Einstein's Writing Task- 'Be a Plover Lover'

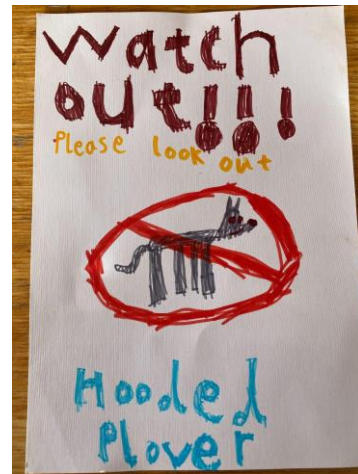
Continuing with our Bird Project, students created signs and posters to inform their readers of how to protect this threatened species of birds.



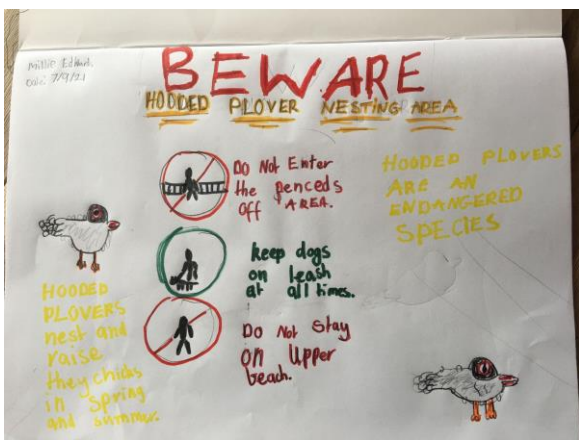

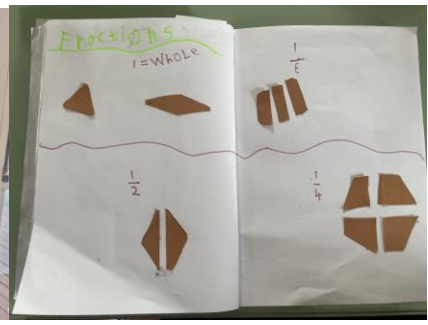
Panther's - Fraction Art: Students created fractions of halves, quarters, thirds and eighths by folding and cutting shapes.

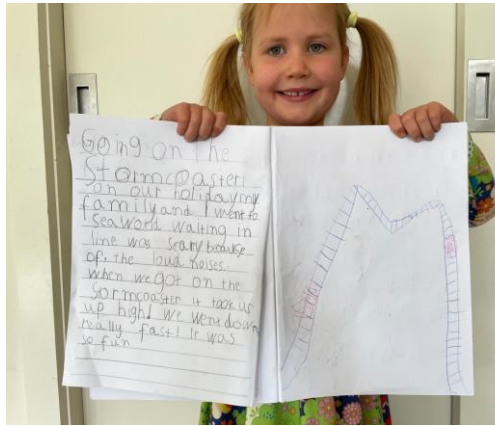

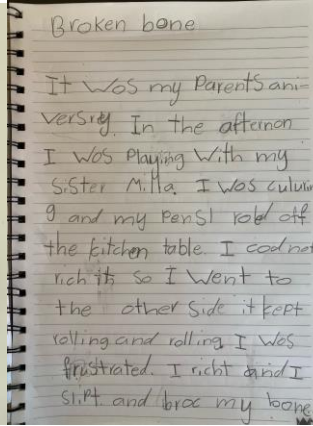

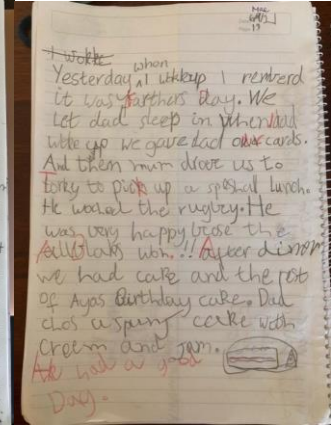
Panthers - Recount Writing: Students wrote a recount about a memory. Focusing on including who was involved, what happened, when it happened, where it happened and why it happened.

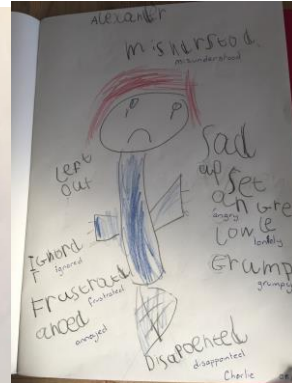
